

Step 7 - Humility

Step 7: Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

I believe there are two types of prayer -

- **HELP** and
- THANK YOU.

Step 7 is a HELP prayer. It couldn't be simpler: "I need your help. Please get this out of my way." Then God puts people and situations in my life that help me learn a better way. This is where God's sense of humor is most apparent. This is also where I sometimes think God is messing with me.

When I first started work on Step 7, I asked God to remove only the specific defect which was most annoying to me at the moment. (*I had not yet learned that I can't do His will my way.*)

It occurred to me that a lot of my emotional upsets were caused by my impatience. So I asked God to help me with patience. Afterwards, every traffic light I came to seemed to be red forever. Every person I talked to seemed to go on and on without getting to the point. Then one day I had an early meeting with a Senior Vice President at the corporation I worked for. On my way to work that morning an accident turned the freeway into a parking lot. Thinking I could still make it on time, I got off onto the surface streets. Then a garbage truck stalled blocking the road. When I pulled into the garage at work with not a second to spare, the woman in front of me had lost her key card and was digging through her purse and her glove compartment trying to find it. I started laughing and impatience has not grabbed me the same way since.

Now when I start to get annoyed, it will occur to me "You know, Robert, if you had allowed yourself a more reasonable amount of time for this you wouldn't be in this quandary." I can still get impatient, but it doesn't sneak up on me and overcome me the way it used to.

As my recovery has progressed, I've gotten less specific in my Step 7 prayers. Now I start the day by asking God to let me know what He wants me to do today and for the desire and the discipline to do it. I also ask Him to remove any obstacles, including any defects in me, that would get in the way.

When I first started doing this, He decided it would be useful for me to stop letting other people take the blame when things went wrong, while I took the credit when things went well. So He put a woman on one of my software development projects who did the same thing to me. I was angry at her until I realized that I had done the same thing to other people. (*Although, surely I did it with more taste and class. LOL.*) Faced with that realization, I wanted to throw up. (*The truth will set you free, but first it will piss you off.*) However, I've been much better about taking

responsibility for failures and much more generous about giving others credit where credit is due.

The principle behind Step 7 is humility. When I have humility, I have a realistic sense of my strengths and weaknesses and gratitude to God for doing for me what I could not do for myself. Humility makes me teachable, which is essential for this step.

SHORTCOMINGS are what my friends call "the trouble with Rob." They are the beliefs and behaviors that get in the way of me being of service to God and others. Most of them originated early in life. They represented the best adaptation I was capable of under the circumstances. I got attached to them because they seemed to work for me at the time. I think they helped me survive, for heaven's sake. Subsequently, they became my automatic response to situations I perceive as similar -- even when they are inappropriate and ineffective. I got so attached to them that I can't just "cut it out" by my own self-will. I need the help of a Higher Power.

A few years ago, one of the "intellectuals" in AA ("Intellectuals" are often "binge thinkers", like me.) asked the GSO to explain the difference between "shortcomings" in Step 7 and "defects of character" in Step 6. As I understand it, the answer was "There is no difference." Two different expressions meaning the same thing were used to avoid repetition in two successive sentences.

III. MINUTES:

- Review and approve minutes of Quarterly Meeting of April 24th 2017
 - Jim moved to approve the minutes as revised. Hud seconded. Motion carried.

IV. <u>FINANCIAL REPORTS</u>:

- Harold presented the April 2017 Financial Report:
 - **Balance Sheet:** Total CBIA funds as of April 30th were \$31,630.71; \$50.00 in Petty Cash; \$16,477.11 in Checking; \$12,603.09 in Prudent Reserve and \$2,500.51 in the Jamboree Account.
 - Profit & Loss for the month of March: Group & Individual Contributions \$1,277.49, Gross Sales (*Books, Chips & Medallions*) \$1,387.50 (*less Cost of Goods Sold \$903.15*), Miscellaneous Income/Refunds \$35.64; Gross Gain for the month was \$1,797.48; Total Expenses were \$3,493.29, for a Net Loss of \$1,695.81 for the month.
 - Hud moved to approve the financial report. Jimmy seconded. Motion carried.

V. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS:</u>

- <u>12th Step</u>: Les said he had nothing new to report.
- Archives: Jimmy said the next display of CBIA archives will be at Founder's Day on June 24th.
- **<u>Bilingual</u>**: Jimmy said he was working on getting a Spanish-speaking person to stand for Trustee in October.
- **Coastal Bender: Hud** said the Coastal Bender went out on time after he reviewed it.
- Corrections/Treatment Facilities: Hud said McConnell is still on lockdown and it's still taking 3-04 weeks to get approval for trained volunteers to be cleared for service in state corrections facilities. He said we are still supporting the same facilities.
- Jamboree: Franny said the Coastal Bend Jamboree Committee is on hiatus in July when work will begin on the 2018 Jamboree.
- <u>Nominations</u>: Franny said recruiting will begin next month for people willing to stand for Trustee at the October election.

- <u>**PI/CPC</u>: Jim** said a Public Information / Cooperation with the Professional Community workshop will be held at the Pine Street Community Center in Victoria after District 7's monthly meeting on May 20th.</u>
- <u>Social</u>: Laurie said she has a good team planning Founder's Day. Their next meeting will be on May 13th at 1:15 at the Anchor Club. The theme will be "The Joy of Good Living". Area 68 Archives Chair K.C.H. will speak about archives. Area Secretary Rae T. and Past CBIA Chair Ed B. will also speak.

 - **Rob** said he is researching an Accounts Payable Balance of \$-395.11 on our Balance Sheet which James H. questioned at our April Quarterly Meeting. This anomaly was basically caused by an error in 2009 when we migrated to Quick Books Non-Profit 2008 and back-entered inventory. Dahlia, our Tax Accountant, said that a bug in that version of Quick Books created this situation (*the root segment and dependent segment(s) for an Accounts Payable transaction are out of balance.*) She said she has a similar situation on her Balance Sheet and decided it was not worth paying a consultant several hundred dollars to correct it.
 - Rob said he and Kelly will take our "mobile book store" to District 7's monthly meeting and PI/CPC workshop in Victoria. Rob said he would like to have a small banner (Coastal BENDER / Coastal Bend Intergroup) to hang on our table in the lobby at the Jamboree and at events like the one in Victoria. He will get a quote for having a banner made.

Service Opportunities

Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (*arrested*, *incarcerated*, *pending*, *etc.*) for at least 18 months.

<u> SATF – Corpus Christi</u>

- <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (*NA provides meetings every other Friday.*) (*New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.*)
- <u>Activity Sponsors</u> take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance*).
- <u>Step Sponsors</u> work the steps with people. (*Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.*)

Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) – Corpus Christi

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

<u>Live Oak County Jail – George West</u>

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesdays. (*Prior clearance is required*).

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (*M*-*F* 7:30 – 11:30 AM and 1:30 – 5:30 PM)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.



Service Opportunities (Continued)

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*). If you would like to be on the 12-Step List or on the Helpline, call Rob or Kelly at the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 or (866) 672-7029.

4. Provides an A.A. listing in the Telephone directory.

5. Provides a 24 hour volunteer phone answering during hours when the office is closed.

6. Publishes meeting schedules of all groups in the Coastal Bend Area at no charge.

7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal Bender", to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.

8. Purchases and sales "CONFERENCE APPROVED' literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.

9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.

10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.

11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
