Step 8 - Brotherly Love

Step 8: Made a list of all persons we had harmed and became willing to make amends to them all.

In early recovery I made amends in such a way that I had to make amends for the way I had made amends. The problem was that I had a hidden agenda -- I wanted to check them off my list and straighten them out at the same time.

I've learned that I need adult supervision in Step 8 to make sure I do not have a hidden agenda, to make sure my amends are appropriate, and to make sure I do not dig the hole deeper. My sponsors have mostly deleted things best left unsaid and kept me focused on my part in it "I was wrong when I . . . and this is what I propose to make it right." No rationalization or justification and certainly no snide remarks.

The principle behind Step 8 is Brotherly Love. A line in The Desiderata captures the spirit of this: "Wherever possible without surrender, be on good terms with all persons." Without surrender means I don't have compromise my integrity to please someone else. I don't owe amends for who I am -- just for my bad behavior. So sponsors have deleted people who did like me for who I am, as long I did not behave badly towards them.

Most of the people on my list came from the resentment inventory I made in Step 4. Other people were added as they occurred to me. I journal about each person on my list:

- Outstanding Resentments. This is the stuff I need to forgive them for. Forgiveness is a decision I make to stop judging them, blaming them, and demonizing them and get on with my life. I may subsequently forget that I made the decision, in which case I just need to remind myself, "Oh. I made a decision to forgive them."
- Outstanding Regrets. This is the stuff I have to make amends for. I need to determine what I need to do in order to forgive myself and allow myself the benefit of God's grace.
- Withheld Appreciation. Often the person involved had made a significant contribution to my life; often we used to have a valued relationship. I need to stop withholding the validation and appreciate them unconditionally.

Finally, I pray for the people on my list. This is related to forgiveness. I don't know that my prayer changes God, but it certainly changes me. I cannot ask God to bless someone every day for very long and still want them to rot in hell.

III. MINUTES:

- Review and approve minutes of Board Meeting of May 8th 2017
 - **Hud** moved to approve the minutes as submitted. **Harold** seconded. Motion carried.

IV. FINANCIAL REPORTS:

- **Harold** presented the **May Financial Report:**
 - **Balance Sheet:** Total CBIA funds as of May 31st were \$31,462.60; \$50.00 in Petty Cash; \$16,309.00 in Checking; \$12,603.09 in Prudent Reserve and \$2,500.51 in the Jamboree Account.
 - **Profit & Loss** for the month of May: Group & Individual Contributions \$3,254.95, Gross Sales (*Books, Chips & Medallions*) \$1,489.50 (*less Cost of Goods Sold \$1,041.06*); Gross Gain for the month was \$3,703.39; Total Expenses were \$3,135.80, for a Net Gain of \$567.59 for the month.
- **Jim** moved to approve the financial report. **Jimmy** seconded. Motion carried.

V. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- **12th Step:** **Les** said he had nothing new to report.
- **Archives:** **Jimmy** said he will set up the CBIA archives display at Founders Day.
- **Bilingual:** **Jimmy** said he had nothing new to report.
- **Coastal Bender:** **Hud** said he reviewed the Bender before publication and it went out on time.
- **Corrections/Treatment Facilities:** **Hud** said the McConnell Unit in Beeville is still locked down and it is still taking 2 weeks to get volunteers approved. Everything else is going well. We are still supporting the same corrections facilities.
- **Jamboree:** **Franny** was not present. **Rob** said the CBJ Committee will be on hiatus until July 8th. He will announce the first committee meeting in the July Bender.
- **Nominations:** **Franny** was not present. **Rob** said he will announce the Trustee Election at the October Quarterly Meeting in the July Bender.

- **PI/CPC: Jim** said Area 68 PI/CPC Chair Larry L. presented a Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community Workshop after District 7's monthly meeting in Victoria last month.
- **Social: Laurie** said Founder's Day was coming together nicely. She said the committee will have its next meeting at 1:15 PM on Saturday at the Anchor Club. She said she needed to pick up CBIA donated books for the door prize.

VI. OFFICE REPORT: Rob

- **CBIA Mobile Book Store.** Rob said he and Kelly sold \$150 worth of AA and Grapevine books and chips and medallions at the Pine Street Community Center in Victoria where District 7 met and the District 7 PI/CPC Workshop was held. We plan to do this again in Victoria in November.
- **CBIA/Bender Banner for CBIA table** at events like the Jamboree and the CBIA Mobile Book Store. Rob said it would cost \$40 without the CBIA logo and \$100 with the logo. (*While we have a high resolution vector file with the BENDER logo, we would have to pay the vendor to create a high resolution vector file with the CBIA logo.*) The consensus was to order a banner with both logos for approximately \$100.
- **Yellow Pages Advertising.** Rob said YP erroneously dropped our ad under Alcoholism from the May 2017 Yellow Pages directory for Corpus Christi and our advertisement in YP.com. He discovered this when he called to inquire why we had not received a bill from them. The directory was published but they were able to put our advertisement back in YP.com. Several business owners on the board said they have stopped advertising with YP. The consensus was that we should stop advertising with YP as soon as possible. It costs over \$800 a year and today most people find us with GOOGLE or other search engines. By virtue of having a commercial phone lines, we will still be listed under Alcoholics Anonymous in the Corpus Christi directories.
- **Balance Sheet Error (AP Liability \$-395.)** Rob said he asked past Delegate James H. how to correct this error. James told him to write it off with a General Journal entries.
 - Hud moved to write it off as proposed. Harold seconded. Motion carried.

Service Opportunities

Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (*arrested, incarcerated, pending, etc.*) for at least 18 months.

SATF – Corpus Christi

- **Attend Meetings** to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (*NA provides meetings every other Friday.*) (*New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.*)
- **Activity Sponsors** take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance.*)
- **Step Sponsors** work the steps with people. (*Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.*)

Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) – Corpus Christi

- **Attend Meetings** to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required.*)

Live Oak County Jail – George West

- **Attend Meetings** to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesdays. (*Prior clearance is required.*)

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (*M-F 7:30 – 11:30 AM and 1:30 – 5:30 PM*)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*). If you would like to be on the 12-Step List or on the Helpline, call Rob or Kelly at the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 or (866) 672-7029.

2. Provides information and referrals for A.A. inquiries.
3. Maintains a 12 Step listing and calls individuals for 12 Step work.
4. Provides an A.A. listing in the Telephone directory.
5. Provides a 24 hour volunteer phone answering during hours when the office is closed.
6. Publishes meeting schedules of all groups in the Coastal Bend Area at no charge.
7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal Bender", to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.
8. Purchases and sales "CONFERENCE APPROVED" literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.
9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
