Walks with God

Most of the last 28 years has been a joyful journey. However, it has included a few walks with God through "Valleys of the Shadow of Death."

Some of the walks have been of my choosing -- decisions I made with God's guidance and the support of the program. When I was 4 years sober, I decided to end a 14-year relationship. Then 11 years ago I decided to take early retirement at age 55 from a company in New England I'd worked for for 32 years and relocate 2,250 miles away -- back here where I grew up. As I walked through these transitions there were times when it didn't seem like such a good idea after all. An obstacle or a negative thought filled me with fear that I'd made a terrible mistake. I was told to "Remember what you were thinking when you were thinking clearly." Along the way, God opened doors for me and gave me little signs (*like a rainbow when I reached the end of the bridge taking me over the Hudson River on my way to Texas*) that let me know I was on the right path.

Some of the walks have NOT been of my choosing. Ten years ago, I walked through a chemo treatment program for a chronic and treatable, but incurable form of cancer (*leukemia and lymphoma*). God has been with me each step of the way and I have felt surrounded by the love, support, and wisdom of people in the program. My challenge has always been to stay in the moment and do the next right thing: To put one foot in front of the other and walk through it. My friend Ken says, "You don't need the ticket until you get on the train."It's been my experience that God doesn't give me courage or other resources before I need them. I think that's His way of letting me know that I'll always be taken care of. There have been terrifying moments, but not one entirely bad day. As long as I stay in the moment, I have the sense that life is good and I am in God's hands. At times I do not know where I'm going, but I know I'm not lost and I know that I will be alright however it unfolds.

Early in my cancer journey, I was misdiagnosed with acute Erythroleukemia, a "brush fire" cancer that would have killed me in a few months. Some good things came out of that

pathology error - I was referred to the M.D. Anderson Cancer Center (ranked #1 cancer hospital in the country). My doctor is the chairman of their Leukemia Department. I couldn't have better care anywhere. In addition, I was forced to confront and lose my fear of dying.

One of my friends is an anesthesiologist. It is her job to revive people when they die on the operating table. She says part of her job is technical (the paddles and injections, etc.) and part of her job is sales, because NOBODY EVER wanted to come back. Baptists, Catholics, Jews, Atheists all liked it better on the other side. She told them, "It's not your time. I promise you that when your time comes, you will return to that place." That told me we will all go to a better place.

C. S. Lewis once said "You ARE a soul. You HAVE a body. It seems to me that people with Alzheimer's sometimes outlive their minds and people with cancer and cardiovascular diseases often outlive their bodies. The soul, the divine within, the essence of who they are lives on forever with their maker.

It occurred to me that there were a few fears that I could and should do something about.

- The fear of being kept alive beyond any hope of quality life because a doctor or a relative couldn't let go. I needed a living will and a health care proxy who was willing and able to pull the plug when the time came.
- The fear of not being ready -- of leaving unfinished business. I needed a current will and directives for cremation and services. I needed to express a few withheld acknowledgements and make a few amends for recent slights. The old amends had been made long ago.
- The fear of 'abandoning' those I care for. Thanks to Al-Anon, I had already detached with love. And the truth is while I made a difference in their lives, I never really was essential. That says it all: I'm not essential and I make a difference. And God loves them and is there for them just as he loves me and is there for me.

What was left was just another Walk with God. I knew that he would go with me every step of the way and that I would be all right forever. It occurred to me that billions of people have successfully died and when my time comes, I'll manage with God's help.

Just for today I am alive and well.

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*). Coastal Bend Intergroup Association Mission Statement

The mission of the Coastal Bend Intergroup Association is to provide the vital first contact to the alcoholic seeking help. The CBIA office must be maintained for the benefit of those still suffering. Of primary importance to this goal, the CBIA Office is to

- Establish a 24-hour help-line;
- Print meeting schedules; and
- Maintain a 12-Step list

whereby AA groups and individuals are enabled to conduct 12-Step calls which are essential to the growth of AA in the Coastal Bend area.

Coastal Bend Intergroup Association Services Provided

- 1. Maintains an office which is open Monday through Friday from 07:30AM to 11:30AM & 1:30PM to 05:30PM.
- 2. Provides information and referrals for A.A. inquiries.
- 3. Maintains a 12 Step listing and calls individuals for 12 Step work.
- 4. Provides an A.A. listing in the Telephone directory.
- 5. Provides a 24 hour volunteer phone answering during hours when the office is closed.
- 6. Publishes meeting schedules of all groups in the Coastal Bend Area at no charge.
- 7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal Bender", to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.
- 8. Purchases and sales "CONFERENCE APPROVED' literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.
- 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
