

Acceptance

One of the reasons I drank is that reality was entirely too much for me. Alcohol took the sharp, painful edge off reality and allowed me to ignore facts that contradicted my fantasies. Alcohol allowed me to believe my own spin. I actually believed that if I was not on time, but I had a good excuse, then I was not really late. My idea was to "exclude" from my mind anything I judged unacceptable. I thought my drinking was acceptable as long as I didn't become an alcoholic. The British poet, Dylan Thomas once said "An alcoholic is someone I don't like who drinks like I do." (Did I mention that he died of alcoholism in 1950?)

In the end, pretending I was not an alcoholic had become a full time job. By that time alcoholism had taken over my life. I wrapped my bottles in newspaper so they wouldn't clink in the trash. I went to three or four liquor stores so the sales clerks wouldn't think I was an alcoholic. I worked hard at coming up with what I thought was a credible spin on my drinking. I claimed I never drank in the morning. If I was still drinking when the sun came up, that was really the tail end of yesterday. If I went to brunch before noon, that was brunch, not morning, and besides a Bloody Mary, a Screwdriver, or a Mimosa is a breakfast beverage. I limited myself to two drinks. In the end that meant two tumblers of chilled vodka without ice. I have learned that what you resist persists.

When I heard people at my first meeting introduce themselves as "grateful recovering alcoholics," I thought, "Give me a freaking break." Ending up an alcoholic in AA seemed like the most horrible thing that had ever happened to me. The first step only required me to admit (or concede) that there was no hope of me controlling my drinking or successfully managing my own life. I didn't have to like it and I didn't. I didn't have to be at peace with it and I wasn't. I just had to admit it.

One of the "deacons" in my original home group in Connecticut was fond of saying that the short form of the Serenity Prayer is "It is what it is." When I began to embrace being an alcoholic and take on doing what one needs to do to be responsible for the disease ("Don't drink and go to meetings" comes to mind, along with getting a sponsor and working the steps). I began to have freedom from the bondage of alcohol. What I thought was the horrible end of my drinking career was really the beautiful beginning of a new life in sobriety. I could accept that. I could be at peace with that. I have come to realize there is no shame in being an alcoholic. The shame is in not accepting it and taking responsibility for it.

With any problem, I am spinning my wheels in the sand until I accept the way things are. Moreover, all of my emotional upsets are caused by my assessment that things shouldn't be they way they are. It's more useful to forgo the assessment and the upset and accept that it is what it is. Then, with the help of God and the program, I can do something constructive about it. One of the best ways to prevent relapse is to be a happy alcoholic (a grateful heart doesn't drink). I always thought I would be happy when I had the right relationship, the right job, the right house, the right car, etc. AA has taught me that happiness doesn't come from getting what I want; it comes from accepting and appreciating what I already have.

III. MINUTES:

- o Minutes of the Quarterly Meeting of January 29th were reviewed.
 - **Harold** moved to approve the minutes as revised. **Linda** seconded. Motion carried.

IV. FINANCIAL REPORTS:

- Harold presented the January Financial Report:
 - o **Balance Sheet:** Total CBIA funds as of January 31st totaled \$29.017.44; \$50.00 in Petty Cash; \$10,228.23 in Checking; \$12,604.05 in Prudent Reserve and \$6,135.16 in the Jamboree Account.
 - o **Profit & Loss** for the month of January: Group & Individual Contributions \$2,261.05; Social Event Revenue \$65.00 Gross Sales (*Books, Chips & Medallions*) \$1,588.75 (*less Cost of Goods Sold \$1,119.52*); Gross Gain for the month was \$2,795.28; Total Expenses were \$3,175.15; for a Net Loss of \$379.87 for the month.
- Franny moved to approve the January Financial Report. Terry seconded. Motion carried.

VI. <u>SERVICE AREA REPORTS</u>

- 12th Step: Jimmy said the Helpline is well staffed and working well.
- <u>Archives</u>: Jimmy said CBIA Archives were displayed at the Jamboree. Rob said this year's display included a hard cover reproduction of the original manuscript of the big book, typed with handwritten changes. Someone mailed it to the CBIA Office anonymously.
- <u>Bilingual</u>: Rosario said Rob give her a list of Spanish-speaking meetings in the Coastal Bend area. **Yoli**, current AA Regional Trustee, was the bi-lingual speaker at the Jamboree. Yoli translated her talk as she spoke.
- <u>Coastal Bender</u>: Terry said she reviewed the draft Bender and caught a couple of typos before it went out, on schedule.
- <u>Corrections</u>: Linda said she attended the Corrections Workshop at the Area 68 Winter Workshop. Linda said she has found corrections service very rewarding for two decades. She supports a meeting for people in the SAFP (Substance Abuse Felony Program) in the state prison facility in San Diego. SAFP is for people who have served time. On release, they generally go to transitional living facility like Avalon in Corpus Christi. This contrasts with

SATF (Substance Abuse Treatment Facility) which is an alternative to incarceration. People are sentenced to SATF instead of prison time.

- **Jamboree: Franny** said she and Rob will attended the Jamboree Committee's post mortem meeting next Saturday. About 750 people attended the Jamboree and it appears the event was a success by any standard.
- Nominations: Franny said she is recruiting a trustee to replace Patty A. who has resigned from the board due to a conflict with her school schedule. Franny plans to have an Intergroup Workshop next summer to let people know about the service opportunities we offer.
- **PI/CPC: Terry** said she plans to attend **ROSC Meetings** the second Friday of each month so we can participated in their Recovery Oriented Services Fair in May.
- Social: Rosario has agreed to be Social Trustee and Patty A. will be Social Chair.

OFFICE REPORT: VI.

- **Rob** said
 - o CBIA book sales at the Jamboree totaled \$159 (about half cash; half credit card).
 - o Premium to renew CBIA insurance 'as is' \$1,009 vs. 994 last year.
 - **Harold** moved to renew the policy 'as is' for \$1,009. **Linda** seconded. Motion carried.
 - o Banner for Founders Day.
 - There were no objections to Rob spending about \$100 on a Banner for Founders Day.

Service Opportunities

Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (arrested, incarcerated, pending, etc.) for at least 18 months.

SATF - Corpus Christi

- <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (NA provides meetings every other Friday.) (New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.)
- <u>Activity Sponsors</u> take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance*).
- <u>Step Sponsors</u> work the steps with people. (*Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.*)

Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) - Corpus Christi

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

<u>Live Oak County Jail – George West</u>

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (M-F7:30-11:30 AM and 1:30-5:30 PM)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.









Service Opportunities (Continued)

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (particularly women) in the surrounding area (like Beeville and Alice). - 1. Maintains an office which is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 to 11:30AM and 1:30 to 5:30PM.
- 2. Provides information and referrals for A.A. inquiries.
- 3. Maintains a 12 Step listing and calls individuals for 12 Step work.
- 4. Provides an A.A. listing in the Telephone directory.
- 5. Provides a 24 hour volunteer phone answering during hours when the office is closed.
- 6. Publishes meeting schedules of all groups in the Coastal Bend Area at no charge.
- 7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal Bender", to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.
- 8. Purchases and sells "CONFERENCE APPROVED' literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.
- 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
