III. MINUTES:

- Minutes of the Quarterly Meeting of July 30th were reviewed.
 - o Franny moved to approve the minutes as read / as revised. Terry seconded. Motion carried.

IV. <u>FINANCIAL REPORTS</u>:

- Harold B. (Financial Trustee) presented the July Financial Report.
 - Balance Sheet: Total CBIA funds as of July 31st totaled \$30,192.93
 \$50.00 in Petty Cash; \$12,421.74 in Checking; \$15,605.24 in Prudent Reserve and \$2,115.95 in the Jamboree Account.
 - o **Profit & Loss** for the month of May: Group & Individual Contributions \$2,054.36; Social Event Revenue \$70.00 Gross Sales (*Books, Chips & Medallions*): \$1,334.00 (*less Cost of Goods Sold \$963.82*); Gross Gain for the month was \$2,494.54; Total Expenses were \$2,859.61; for a Net Loss of \$365.07 for the month.

While YTD expenses are very close to budget: \$23,093.40 spent vs \$22,987.35 budgeted, we are falling behind in terms of ACTUAL VS BUDGETED YTD REVENUE (which was based on last year's revenue).

- o **Group Contributions** are down \$2,536.04
- o **Social Event Revenue** is down \$1,759.00
- o **Net Sales** (*Books*, *etc*) is down \$1,021.21

YTD Net Revenue is down \$5,316.68

Fortunately, we have a prudent reserve. However, we are not doing as well as we did last year.

• **Terry** moved to approve the May Financial Report. **Linda** seconded. Motion carried.

- 12th Step: Ron said the helpline is well staffed and running smoothly.
- Archives: Jimmy said the CBIA archives will be displayed at the Jamboree in January.

- <u>Coastal Bender</u>: Terry said she reviewed the Bender before it was published. It went out on time and looks very good.
- <u>Corrections</u>: Linda said the Glassbrenner Unit in San Diego has a new warden and is still missing a Chaplin. She continues to work on a spreadsheet showing which facilities in the Coastal Bend area have AA meetings and who is supporting them.

Service Opportunities

Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (arrested, incarcerated, pending, etc.) for at least 18 months.

<u>SATF – Corpus Christi</u>

- <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (NA provides meetings every other Friday.) (New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.)
- <u>Activity Sponsors</u> take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance*).
- <u>Step Sponsors</u> work the steps with people. (Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.)

Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) - Corpus Christi

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

Live Oak County Jail - George West

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (M-F 7:30 – 11:30 AM and 1:30 – 5:30 PM)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.









Service Opportunities (Continued)

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*). - 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
