

Maintaining / Re-building

MAINTAINING

I got sober in Connecticut where I attended the state AA Convention every year. One of my favorite things was the Old Timer Panel. Every time, the message I got was "Do what you did in the beginning. The simple little things that got you sober will keep your sober, day by day, year after year."

When I was 17 years sober, I retired from a corporate job and eventually returned to Corpus Christi, Texas where I grew up. Here, I heard about five daily things. While not an official AA suggestion, they provide a useful structure for maintaining my spiritual condition and getting my daily reprieve. The five daily things:

- Ask God to help me stay sober today. (This is part of my morning prayer and meditation.)
- Go to meetings. (I have a weekly regimen of meetings I attend. If it's Monday, I go to Weber at noon. I do better if I don't think about "Do I feel like going to a meeting? What meeting do I fancy today?" I just go.)
- Make a sober contact. (Sometimes I call my sponsor (at least once a week). Sometimes I talk to one of the people I sponsor. Sometimes I talk to another member of the fellowship. But every day I tell someone how it's going and how I'm doing either can be off.)
- Read AA Conference-Approved Literature. (I like to read today's page in Daily Reflections and something in the Big Book.)
- Thank God for helping me stay sober. (This is part of my evening prayer and meditation.)

It is also very important for me to do a 10th Step Inventory every evening. I review my calendar and task list for the day and ask myself, "Did I keep my promises? What could I have done better? Was I kind to everyone? Do I owe amends?"

REBUILDING

When I retired, I bought an Airstream travel trailer and traveled a lot the first year. I attended an Airstream Rally in Tucson, AZ (near the Mexican border) and another rally in Burlington, VT (near the Canadian border) and I explored a lot between here and there. I spent a month in Tucson and the first thing I did was find the meetings I would attend, the pharmacy and super market I would frequent, etc. My dog and I settled into a new routine – our new normal. I repeated that everywhere we went.

Towards the end of the first year we settled in Corpus Christi. I identified my HEB and my Walgreen's and I picked Weber as my home group. In the beginning, I was there every time they had a meeting. I went to lunch with people after the noon meetings.

After a while, I realized that I needed a local sponsor – someone I saw on a regular basis and could have lunch or coffee with. When my first and second sponsors in Corpus Christi died, it was important for me to get another sponsor and build a relationship with them. When my third sponsor moved a way, again I needed to get another sponsor.

 \$50.00 in Petty Cash; \$8,831.43 in Checking; \$15,607.21 in Prudent Reserve and \$2,115.95 in the Jamboree Account.
 - Profit & Loss for the month of September: Group & Individual Contributions \$1,151.05; Gross Sales (Books, Chips & Medallions): \$1,086.00 (less Cost of Goods Sold \$752.54); Gross Gain for the month was \$1,484.51; Total Expenses were \$2,807.80; Interest Income was \$1.97 for a Net Loss of \$1,321.32 for the month.

While YTD expenses are under budget: \$29,568.61 spent vs. \$30,618.74 budgeted, we are falling behind in terms of YTD Actual VS Budgeted Revenue.

Service Opportunities

Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (arrested, incarcerated, pending, etc.) for at least 18 months.

<u>SATF – Corpus Christi (See attached application to sponsor at SATF)</u> *

- <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (NA provides meetings every other Friday.) (New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.)
- <u>Activity Sponsors</u> take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance*).
- <u>Step Sponsors</u> work the steps with people. (Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.)

Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) - Corpus Christi

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

<u>Live Oak County Jail – George West</u>

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (M-F 7:30 – 11:30 AM and 1:30 – 5:30 PM)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.









Service Opportunities (Continued)

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*). - 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
