The Presbyterian Church (305 W. Fannin Street in Refugio) is home of Refugio Group. They have meetings at 7:00 PM on Thursdays. This Group did not have a place to meet for a year and a half after Hurricane Harvey in August 2017. Until recently, people were car pooling to Goliad to attend the Open Arms Group.



Founded in 1999 (20 years ago), Sunset Seven meets on North Padre Island (part of the City of Corpus Christi). They meet at 7:00 PM Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at the Presbyterian Church (14030 Fortuna Bay in CC) and they have a beach meeting at 8:00 AM in a gazebo on the board walk near the Brisco Pavilion in Padre Bali Park off Park Road 22.

Step 5 - Integrity

Step 5: Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

This was hard for me because I had lived my life like appearances are everything. I was much more concerned with looking good that with doing good. Unfortunately the greater my academic and professional accomplishments, the more impressive stuff I acquired, the louder my disease screamed "You are a phony." So I never really got the satisfaction or happiness I expected.

My greatest fear was that if you really knew what I was like and what I had done you would not like me and you would leave me and poor little Robby would be all alone living in the park at Christmas. So when I did my first fifth step with my sponsor, I half expected him to run screaming into the night. What I got was unconditional love. He told me about similar things he had done. I learned that **nothing human is unmentionable and nothing mentionable is unmanageable.**

Later I shared some of my deepest darkest secrets at a meeting. In the middle of it, people got up to get coffee and to go to the restroom. And I realized that **nobody but me was wrecked over this stuff**. I have learned that anything I am hiding from anybody takes a toll on me and anything I am hiding from everybody is eating me alive.

For me, the primary principle behind Step 5 is INTEGRITY: To thine own self be true. It is about holding me accountable for having my behavior be consistent with the sort of person I aspire to be, the sort of person God created me to be. INTEGRAL means the parts fit perfectly into the whole. I have become a full member of the human race, striving to fulfill the role God has in mind for me.

My lack of integrity most often showed up in what I did not say. Perhaps my ex- would not notice that we now have only 11 Waterford tumblers. If my parents or my teachers wanted to think that somebody else did it, who am I to tell them otherwise.

I used to get upset (make that self-righteous anger) thinking that somebody else was getting away with something. I have learned that in the end nobody gets away with anything, so the best course is always to take responsibility for what I did or did not do. Regardless of what other people think, I will know what I did and I will not be OK with myself, with God or with them until I own up to it.

When I was drinking, none of the physicians or mental health professionals I consulted were able to help me very much because I did not tell the truth about my drinking. One of the reasons I have usually chosen to do Step 5 with my sponsor is that I have a rule for myself "Don't ever withhold anything from your sponsor." A withhold is anything I do not want him to know, usually because I think he will think less of me or because I am afraid I won't be

able to get away with doing something questionable that I want to do. So before I hang up the phone or before I leave, I ask myself "What are you withholding?" Often I've been thinking about doing something foolish -- perhaps something that will require amends; perhaps something self-destructive. Then I say, "And another thing I need to tell you . . ."

I think it is important for one person to know EVERYTHING about me. In early recovery, I went from person to person and from meeting, dropping a secret here and a secret there. That was better than hiding it from everybody, but it left me thinking "If anybody knew EVERYTHING, they wouldn't accept me."

From Step 5, I learned that I was not as good as I had hoped or as bad as I had feared. I was not the best little boy in the world and I was not the worst little boy in the world. I am, in a word, human. And that makes me part angelic child of God and part selfish and self-centered jerk.

Step 5 gave me a more realistic sense of my strengths and weaknesses which is necessary for me to have humility and be teachable. Taking Step 5 helped me identify patterns of bad behavior. While I never enjoy discovering these things (The truth will set you free, but first it will piss you off.), AA has given me the wherewithal to transform my rude awakenings into spiritual awakenings. There is great leverage in identifying my patterns: addressing one pattern can resolve a number of seemingly unrelated problems.

Having taken Step 5 is a deterrent to future bad behavior. Just thinking that I won't want to tell my sponsor about doing something, makes me think twice about doing it. I know that if I do it, sooner or later, I will tell Sponsor Dearest. So would it not be better to just not do it in the first place?

- 12th Step: Ron said there are no problems with the Helpline.
- Archive: Gail said the next display of CBIA Archives will be at Founders Day on June 8th.

- <u>Coastal Bender</u>: Terry said Rob is doing a good job editing the BENDER. Linda requested that we include a form for new subscriptions to the publication. Rob agreed to include this in the April issue.
- <u>Corrections/Treatment Facilities</u>: Linda said she was unable to speak on corrections service work at **Bookmarks** because of a funeral in Seattle. She will reschedule. Now that the Glossbrenner Unit has a chaplin, inmates are being giving donated big books. **Terry** said she

would text Linda contact information for a man who had done a lot of corrections service before he relocated to Portland.

Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (arrested, incarcerated, pending, etc.) for at least 18 months.

<u>SATF – Corpus Christi (See attached application to sponsor at SATF)</u> *

- <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (NA provides meetings every other Friday.) (New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.)
- <u>Activity Sponsors</u> take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance*).
- **Step Sponsors** work the steps with people. (Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.)

Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) - Corpus Christi

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

Live Oak County Jail – George West

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (M-F7:30-11:30 AM and 1:30-5:30 PM)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.









Service Opportunities (Continued)

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*). - 1. Maintains an office which is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 to 11:30AM and 1:30 to 5:30PM.
- 2. Provides information and referrals for A.A. inquiries.
- 3. Maintains a 12 Step listing and calls individuals for 12 Step work.
- 4. Provides an A.A. listing in the Telephone directory.
- 5. Provides a 24 hour volunteer phone answering during hours when the office is closed.
- 6. Publishes meeting schedules of all groups in the Coastal Bend Area at no charge.
- 7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal Bender", to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.
- 8. Purchases and sells "CONFERENCE APPROVED' literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.
- 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
