Founder's Day Cake - Celebrating AA's 84<sup>th</sup> Birthday

61 people attended CBIA's annual celebration of AA's Birthday. Two speakers (Gail B. from Victoria Unity & Don J. from New Phoenix spoke), Lunch (Chicken Alfredo), Door Prizes and Raffle Baskets were featured.

On June 10<sup>th</sup>, 1935 Bill Wilson (a stock broker from New York City) carried the AA message to Dr. Bob Smith (a proctologist in Acron, OH) and they both stayed sober for the rest of their lives (Bob died 15 years later in 1950; Bill died 36 years later in 1971.) October 10<sup>th</sup>, 1935 is considered the start of AA.

## Step 7 - Humility

## Step 7: Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

I believe there are two types of prayer -

- HELP and
- THANK YOU.

Step 7 is a HELP prayer. It couldn't be simpler: "I need your help. Please get this out of my way." Then God puts people and situations in my life that help me learn a better way. This is where God's sense of humor is most apparent. This is also where I sometimes think God is messing with me.

When I first started work on Step 7, I asked God to remove only the specific defect which was most annoying to me at the moment. (I had not yet learned that I can't do His will my way.)

It occurred to me that a lot of my emotional upsets were caused by my impatience. So I asked God to help me with patience. Afterwards, every traffic light I came to seemed to be red forever. Every person I talked to seemed to go on and on without getting to the point. Then one day I had an early meeting with a Senior Vice President at the corporation I worked for. On my way to work that morning an accident turned the freeway into a parking lot. Thinking I could still make it on time, I got off onto the surface streets. Then a garbage truck stalled blocking the road. When I pulled into the garage at work with not a second to spare, the woman in front of me had lost her key card and was digging through her purse and her glove compartment trying to find it. I started laughing and impatience has not grabbed me the same way since.

Now when I start to get annoyed, it will occur to me "You know, Robert, if you had allowed yourself a more reasonable amount of time for this you wouldn't be in this quandary." I can still get impatient, but it doesn't sneak up on me and overcome me the way it used to.

As my recovery has progressed, I've gotten less specific in my Step 7 prayers. Now I start the day by asking God to let me know what He wants me to do today and for the desire and the discipline to do it. I also ask Him to remove any obstacles, including any defects in me, that would get in the way.

When I first started doing this, He decided it would be useful for me to stop letting other people take the blame when things went wrong, while I took the credit when things went well. So He put a woman on one of my software development projects who did the same thing to me. I was angry at her until I realized that I had done the same thing to other people. (Although, surely I did it with more taste and class. LOL.) Faced with that realization, I wanted to throw up. (The truth will set you free, but first it will piss you off.) However, I've been much better about taking

responsibility for failures and much more generous about giving others credit where credit is due.

The principle behind Step 7 is humility. When I have humility, I have a realistic sense of my strengths and weaknesses and gratitude to God for doing for me what I could not do for myself. Humility makes me teachable, which is essential for this step.

SHORTCOMINGS are what my friends call "the trouble with Rob." They are the beliefs and behaviors that get in the way of me being of service to God and others. Most of them originated early in life. They represented the best adaptation I was capable of under the circumstances. I got attached to them because they seemed to work for me at the time. I think they helped me survive, for heaven's sake. Subsequently, they became my automatic response to situations I perceive as similar -- even when they are inappropriate and ineffective. I got so attached to them that I can't just "cut it out" by my own self-will. I need the help of a Higher Power.

A few years ago, one of the "intellectuals" in AA ("Intellectuals" are often "binge thinkers", like me.) asked the GSO to explain the difference between "shortcomings" in Step 7 and "defects of character" in Step 6. As I understand it, the answer was "There is no difference." Two different expressions meaning the same thing were used to avoid repetition in two successive sentences.

#### **Volunteers Needed to Carry the Message in Corrections Facilities**

Volunteers are needed to carry the message to alcoholics in corrections facilities. You must be at least 18 years old and not been in trouble with the law (arrested, incarcerated, pending, etc.) for at least 18 months.

#### <u>SATF – Corpus Christi (See attached application to sponsor at SATF)</u> \*

- <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support separate men's and women's meetings at 8:00 PM on alternate Fridays. (NA provides meetings every other Friday.) (New development: prior clearance is now required to attend meetings at SATF.)
- <u>Activity Sponsors</u> take people to meetings once a week or so. (*Minimum one year sober and prior clearance*).
- <u>Step Sponsors</u> work the steps with people. (Minimum two years sober and prior clearance.)

### Avalon (Formerly Reality Ranch) - Corpus Christi

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 8:00 PM every Sunday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

## Live Oak County Jail - George West

• <u>Attend Meetings</u> to support a men's meeting at 7:00 PM every Wednesday. (*Prior clearance is required*).

If you are interested in any of these service opportunities, call the CBIA Office (361) 992-8911 during business hours (M-F7:30-11:30 AM and 1:30-5:30 PM)

Where clearance is required, provide us your full name, as it appears on your driver's license, your driver's license number and state and state of issue at least 3 weeks prior to service. You must also indicate which specific meeting(s) you plan to attend.

To volunteer in state prison facilities, you must complete a Department of Criminal Justice training session. This training is very helpful for people who volunteer in any corrections facility, but it is a prerequisite for state jails and prisons. The training is offered in state facilities in Beeville and elsewhere.









## **Service Opportunities** (Continued)

### Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. The helpline is pretty well staffed at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. We especially need people (*particularly women*) in the surrounding area (*like Beeville and Alice*).
