# Working the 12 Steps Every Day

When I first saw the 12 Steps, they were on the wall at my first meeting. I thought they were like Pool Rules, displayed beside the swimming pool at the Country Club, mainly there to limit the club's liability for accidents.

After a few more meetings I had heard people talk about the steps and my thinking evolved to "12 Steps; 12 Weeks; All Better." I thought if I applied myself and did them right (with my engineering background), I would only have to work them once and then I could put them behind me and get on with my life. 35 years later I am still not through and the end is nowhere in sight.

Early on, a wise old timer told me "Instead of trying to put the program into your life, it would work better to put your life into the program." Did I mention that I believe the steps are the program. (It comes with a lovely fellowship, but the 12 steps are the program of recovery.) When I came to Texas from Connecticut to visit my parents in 1985, I heard a cowboy say, "If you haven't worked all 12 Steps with a sponsor, you're walking around with an untreated case of alcoholism." The steps have become the way I do life.

And if I want to stay sober, I think I had better work all 12 Steps every day. This is not as daunting as it seems.

My morning / evening prayers and meditation cover steps 1-3 and 11.

- When I ask God to keep me sober in the morning and thank him at night, I'm working Step 1 and 2 again.
- When I say the Third Step Prayer, I am working Step 3.
- All my prayers and transcendental meditation covers Step 11.

My daily 10th Step inventory (review my day, admit where I was wrong and do what I need to do to make things right) covers Steps 4 - 10.

Step 12 involves carrying the message to others and everything else I do in my daily life (practicing these principles in all my affairs.)

Working all 12 steps with adult supervision from a sponsor is what taught me how to do this and laid the groundwork for my daily spiritual practices.

#### III. MINUTES:

- Minutes of the Board Meeting of February 10<sup>th</sup> were reviewed.
  - o **Enrique** moved to approve the minutes as read. Harry seconded. Motion carried.

#### IV. <u>FINANCIAL REPORTS</u>:

- Linda (Financial Trustee) presented the February Financial Report.
  - o Balance Sheet: Total CBIA funds as of February 29th totaled \$33,732.76; \$50.00 in Petty Cash; \$7,414.76 in Checking; \$15,616.98 in Prudent Reserve and \$10,651.02 in the Jamboree Account.
  - o **Profit & Loss** for the month of **February**: Group & Individual Contributions **\$469.29**; Jamboree Contributions: \$7,500.00 Gross Sales (*Books, Chips & Medallions*): **\$1,149.25** less Cost of Goods Sold \$776.81); Gross Gain for the month was **\$8,443.73**; Total Expenses were **\$2,779.99** for a Net Gain of **\$5,561.74** for the month.
    - o **Enrique** moved to approve the financial report. **Barb** seconded. Motion carried.
- **Linda** (*Financial Trustee*) presented **the 2020 Budget** which provided for annual revenue equal to actual revenue in 2019 at \$35,409.51 and total expenses of \$37,932.71. Due to significant reduction in jamboree revenue and Group Contributions, we are already behind budget. Depending on how the year unfolds, we will likely have to draw money out of Prudent Reserve savings to stay afloat.
  - o **Barb** moved to approve the budget. **Enrique** seconded. Motion carried.
  - o **Jackie B.** (*Past CBIA Chair*) talked about visiting the groups during the recovery from a financial crisis in the early 1990's. What they did / did not do: they talked about the services that we provide, and they talked about our current financial situation. They did not ask for money they made clear that is up to each group conscience.

#### V. SERVICE AREA REPORTS:

- <u>12th Step</u> Judy as not present.
- Archives Gail said she was taking the overflow archives (not organized for display at Founders Day or the Jamboree) home to organize it.
- **<u>Bilingual</u> Enrique** said he had nothing new to report.

# **Zoom Workshop** – 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition During COVID 19 (Sat., Apr.25<sup>th</sup>)

Attached is a recap of a Zoom Workshop on 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition During COVID 19 which was held on Saturday, April 25<sup>th</sup>. A carefully selected panel discussed keeping home groups, Districts, Areas, GSO and Intergroup Offices going without revenue from face-to-face meetings.

## One Local Group

At its last group conscience, one large local group determined that they would not be able to make donations to service entities until they built back up to their prudent reserve. They suggested that members send a check payable to the group for their No Dues or Fees to the Group Treasurer at his home address. They also suggested that it would be a good idea to send anonymous individual contributions to GSO, the local intergroup office, etc. Those addresses are displayed (using the Share Screen Feature) during the announcements at each Zoom Meeting. Donations to GSO or intergroup can made online using the donate button on either web site.









# **CBIA and the Corona Virus Pandemic**

#### **THE CONTEXT**

The President and the Center for Disease Control have asked that gatherings of more than 10 people not be held and that we observe personal space of six feet from other people, not touch and frequently wash our hands for 20 seconds, etc. Elderly people and people in other risk groups are asked to stay home. Serving coffee or anything edible is probably not a good idea. Face masks are a good idea any time you will be around other people.

#### (1) CBIA OFFICE

We are closing the office until 5/12/2020, when we will hold our next board meeting. Kelly will work from home in the morning and Rob work from home in the afternoon Monday thru Friday. The board has determined that we will not sell merchandise (books, chips, etc.) while the office is closed. The volunteer helpline will answer the phones during the lunch hour, overnight, and on weekends as usual.

#### (2) **BOARD MEETING**

The May CBIA board meeting will be held on Zoom so we don't have people traveling from Victoria, AP and Kingsville and we aren't assembling 8 people in our small board room.

#### (3) **QUARTERLY MEETINGS**

The April Quarterly meeting has been canceled. The next scheduled Quarterly Meeting is set for 7/27/2020.

#### (4) <u>LET US KNOW ABOUT MEETINGS TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED</u>

Please let us know of changes in the status of meetings — meetings temporarily suspended or meeting again. We are putting the phrase 'Temp Susp' before the name of the group on our printable schedules, on our meeting data base and the smart phone app Meeting Guide to indicate it is temporarily suspended. Also let us know about Zoom meetings if you want them publicized. They must be sponsored by a registered AA Group and conducted as an AA Meeting.









# **Alternatives to Face-to-Face Meetings**

While there is nothing like a face-to-face meeting, many of us need to find other alternatives for the next few weeks or months.

- **Telephone Calls** Some of us are calling our sponsors or other people in the program more often than we were. Some groups are using telephone trees to stay in touch. Some of us are calling people in the program we were once close to who are now separated by geography.
- **Email** Some of us are emailing our sponsors or other people in the program more often than we were. Some groups are circulating chain emails. (*Consider submitting something you have written for publication as an article in the BENDER*.)
- Listening to AA Speakers on CD or MP3 files or on web sites like <u>www.aa-speakers.com</u>
- **Read AA Literature** The stories in the back of the big book offer some of the benefits of attending a speaker meeting.
- Attending an on-line or dial-in AA meeting. There is a link on the CBIA website <a href="www.cbiaa.org">www.cbiaa.org</a> to the Online Intergroup <a href="http://aa-intergroup.org/">http://aa-intergroup.org/</a>. These meetings were set up for loners people in remote locations and people who are homebound. Lately, traffic from people who ordinarily attend face-to-face meetings has been overwhelming this facility. Beware of other sites that offer alcoholism recovery meetings that are not traditional AA.
- Starting an on-line or dial-in AA meeting. It is easier than you think to start an on-line or dial-in meeting. This link <a href="https://www.nyintergroup.org/remote-meeting-listing/help-setting-up-online-meetings/">https://www.nyintergroup.org/remote-meeting-listing/help-setting-up-online-meetings/</a> provides all the instructions you need to start a meeting with Google Hangout; Zoom or Free Conference Call. Google Hangout and Zoom are slicker, but Free Conference Call might be easier for someone without a lot of technical skills. It would be a good idea to have this sponsored by an established face-to-face meeting and observe all AA Traditions. DJ in Victoria has offered her technical skills to help do this. Call (361) 484-0365.
- Read an article in the AA Grapevine. To give us something to do while we are sheltered at home, the AA Grapevine is allowing free limited access to their web site. This allows you to read any article in any 2020 issue of the Grapevine. To do this, go to <a href="https://www.aagrapevine.org/magazine">www.aagrapevine.org/magazine</a>. Click on the issue you want to read. Then click on Table of Contents. Then click on Read under the article you fancy.
