

Taking Care of Yourself

Discharging or Re-Charging

As a sponsor in AA and other 12 step programs, I imagine that I have a virtual battery gauge -- similar to the battery gauge in my truck that lets me know if the batteries in the truck and the connected Airstream were being charged by the alternator or if they were discharging and running down.

On a 2,200-mile road trip with my Airstream trailer, I noticed that the battery was discharging as I drove. The alternator was not charging the batteries. After stopping in a remote rest area to walk my dog, I could not re-start the truck because the batteries were dead. I have since learned to pay attention to this and other gauges more closely.

As a member of the fellowship helping others and, especially, as a sponsor, I need to watch my internal virtual battery gauge. If I am in good shape physically and spiritually, then working with others can charge my battery -- provided I remain detached and don't take on other people's problems as my own. It is as if the current from my higher power flows through me to them, charging my battery in the process.

If I'm not in good shape, physically and spiritually; if I take on their problems as my own; if I don't accept that I can't fix them or their problems, then my battery is running down and I'm headed for trouble. This is much harder with relatives and close friends in whom I have a lot invested.

When I was five years sober, I was spending all my AA socializing time hanging out with the small flock of newcomers I was sponsoring. I was not spending much time with my sponsor or other old timers. I got about as crazy as the newcomers were. One day when we were all a hot mess at the same time, the thought occurred to me I should load them all in my convertible and drive to the bridge so we could all jump together.

I have since learned that if I do not take care of myself, I will not be much help to anybody else. When I was a teenager and being trained to be a lifeguard, the Red Cross taught me to think of my own safety first and then do whatever I could to help others without putting myself at risk. Otherwise, we would both drown.

In 1995, the theme of a convention I attended in Connecticut was "Everybody has a higher power." They gave out refrigerator magnets with the theme on them. My sponsor had me add "and it's not you, Rob" to my magnet before I stuck it on my refrigerator.

Taking care of myself means not letting myself get too

- Hungry
- Angry
- Lonely or
- Tired.

Taking Care of Yourself (Continued)

Taking care of myself means going to meetings and talking about what is going on with me. Taking care of myself means not withholding anything from my sponsor.

If I were forced to pick a single slogan as my very favorite, it would be "Do the next right thing." I use that a lot. Over the years people have frequently misquoted me. "Do the next best thing" means something entirely different.

Anything I need to do to take care of myself is a right thing. All the suggestions of the program are right things. However, if I am hungry the NEXT right thing is to eat something. If I'm angry, the NEXT right thing is to step away from the situation so I don't do or say something I will regret later and process the anger -- asking "What am I afraid of?" If I am lonely, the NEXT right thing is often to make a sober contact and talk about what is going on with me with my Sponsor or another member of the program. If I am tired, the NEXT right thing is to take a nap or go to bed early. If I am restless, irritable, and discontent and I have missed several of my regular meetings, the NEXT right thing is to go to a meeting.

7th Tradition and the Corona Virus Pandemic

7th Tradition During COVID 19 (Sat., Apr.25th)

This year, the challenge is keeping home groups, Districts, Areas, GSO and Intergroup Offices going with reduced revenue from face-to-face meetings. GSO and Intergroup Offices have ongoing overhead for salaries, rent, etc. Individual donations to GSO and CBIA can be made online under the donate tab on our web sites. Some groups and districts can now accept online donations via Venmo or Pay Pal.

One Local Group

At a recent group conscience, one large local group determined that they would not be able to make donations to service entities until they built back up to their prudent reserve. They suggested that members send a check payable to the group for their No Dues or Fees to the Group Treasurer at his home address. They also suggested that it would be a good idea to send anonymous individual contributions to GSO, the local intergroup office, etc. Those addresses are displayed (using the Share Screen Feature) during the announcements at each of their AA Meetings on Zoom. Donations to GSO or intergroup can made online using the donate button on either web site.









CBIA and the Corona Virus Pandemic

THE CONTEXT

The President and the Center for Disease Control have asked that gatherings of more than 10 people not be held and that we observe personal space of six feet from other people, not touch and frequently wash our hands for 20 seconds, etc. Elderly people and people in other risk groups are asked to stay home. Serving coffee or anything edible is probably not a good idea. Face masks are a good idea any time you will be around other people.

(1) CBIA OFFICE

We are closing the office until at least 6/9/2020, when we will hold our next board meeting. Kelly will work from home in the morning and Rob will work from home in the afternoon Monday thru Friday. The board has determined that while the office is closed, we will try selling merchandise (books, chips, and medallions) over the phone with pre-arranged curbside pickup available about once a week (generally Monday mornings.)

(2) BOARD MEETING

The June CBIA board meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 9th on Zoom so we do not have people traveling from Victoria, AP and Kingsville and we aren't assembling 8 people in our small board room.

(3) **QUARTERLY MEETINGS**

The next scheduled Quarterly Meeting is set for 7/27/2020 at 6:00 PM on ZOOM. The Meeting ID and Password will be published in the July BENDER and BITS & PIECES.

(4) <u>LET US KNOW ABOUT MEETINGS TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED</u>

Please let us know of changes in the status of meetings — meetings temporarily suspended or meeting again. We are putting the phrase 'Temp Susp' before the name of the group on our printable schedules, on our meeting data base and the smart phone app Meeting Guide to indicate it is temporarily suspended. Also let us know about Zoom meetings if you want them publicized. They must be sponsored by a registered AA Group and conducted as an AA Meeting.









Alternatives to Face-to-Face Meetings

While there is nothing like a face-to-face meeting, many of us need to find other alternatives for the next few weeks or months.

- **Telephone Calls** Some of us are calling our sponsors or other people in the program more often than we were. Some groups are using telephone trees to stay in touch. Some of us are calling people in the program we were once close to who are now separated by geography.
- **Email** Some of us are emailing our sponsors or other people in the program more often than we were. Some groups are circulating chain emails. (*Consider submitting something you have written for publication as an article in the BENDER*.)
- Listening to AA Speakers on CD or MP3 files or on web sites like <u>www.aa-speakers.com</u>
- **Read AA Literature** The stories in the back of the big book offer some of the benefits of attending a speaker meeting.
- Attending an on-line or dial-in AA meeting. There is a link on the CBIA website www.cbiaa.org to the Online Intergroup http://aa-intergroup.org/. These meetings were set up for loners people in remote locations and people who are homebound. Lately, traffic from people who ordinarily attend face-to-face meetings has been overwhelming this facility. Beware of other sites that offer alcoholism recovery meetings that are not traditional AA.
- Starting an on-line or dial-in AA meeting. It is easier than you think to start an on-line or dial-in meeting. This link https://www.nyintergroup.org/remote-meeting-listing/help-setting-up-online-meetings/ provides all the instructions you need to start a meeting with Google Hangout; Zoom or Free Conference Call. Google Hangout and Zoom are slicker, but Free Conference Call might be easier for someone without a lot of technical skills. It would be a good idea to have this sponsored by an established face-to-face meeting and observe all AA Traditions. DJ in Victoria has offered her technical skills to help do this. Call (361) 484-0365.
- **Read an article in the AA Grapevine.** To give us something to do while we are sheltered at home, **the AA Grapevine is allowing free limited access to their web site**. This allows you to read any article in any 2020 issue of the Grapevine. To do this, go to www.aagrapevine.org/magazine. Click on the issue you want to read. Then click on **Table of Contents.** Then click on **Read** under the article you fancy.

Helpline / 12 Step List

The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who are making sure that the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day in the Coastal Bend area by answering the phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday; or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. We need a few additional helpline volunteers at present.

If someone needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation and maybe a visit to discuss how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12-Step List. We can always use more people on the 12-Step List. - 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
