## Step 9: Responsibility

# Step 9: Made direct amends to such people except when to do so would injure them or others.

If you have trouble with any step, go back to the previous step. Nowhere is that truer than with Step 9. In my experience, most of the work was done in Step 8, with adult supervision from my sponsor and others. I revisited my past to get clear about what I had done to the people on my list and what I needed to do to make it right; I prayed for them until I wished them well; I cleared away rationalization, justification and resentment and I forgave them for their part.

Then Step 9 became JUST DO IT. Each time I made amends, I had to swallow my pride and begin with "I was wr-wr-wrong when I . . ." (that word always sticks in my throat). Then I needed to say what I proposed to do to make it right (e.g., pay them back) and perhaps some unexpressed acknowledgment or appreciation of them. Then I needed to shut up -- before I talked myself back into rationalization, justification and resentment. Any hint of that and the other person would forget the amends and be left with more of the same.

When I had completed my Step 8 work, when the time was right for me and for them, my Higher Power put people in my life I hadn't seen for years. Or he sent me somebody who knew how to get in touch with them. Or he put the two of us in a seemingly magical situation. And I knew it was now or never -- or at least there would never be a better opportunity. I've learned to act promptly on this gentle nudging from my Higher Power. People have died or have become unavailable in other ways shortly after a nudge and I either seized the opportunity or I missed it.

As with Step 4, putting off amends makes them seem harder than they are. I tell myself, "If it wasn't terribly difficult, I would have done it long ago." The truth is that thinking about it was usually worse than actually doing it.

Most of the people I've made amends to were generous with me. Some made amends to me. Some said it was no big deal and they were surprised I would bring it up. To them I said, "It was bothering me. The person I aspire to be, the person God created me to be, would not have done what I did." Others were less gracious. When I told one of my coworkers that I had been wrong and had acted like a jerk, she said, "No shit." I expected her to admit that she'd been wrong and that she had acted like a bitch. She didn't. However, we went on to have a successful working relationship, so I think the amends were successful after all.

Half way through Step 9 you get your promises. The purpose of the steps is to make me available to the Grace of God and the promises are what the Grace of God looks like in my life. I was not willing to forgive myself, to give myself a break, to allow myself to have the benefit of God's generosity until I had made significant progress at cleaning up the wreckage of my past with Step 9. Hence, before I was halfway through, I experienced a new freedom . . .

## **Group Contributions**

In the past, CBIA's second biggest source of revenue has been Group Contributions. Since COVID-19 came to this area in March of 2020, we have some groups that are starting to meet in person, others are still meeting only on Zoom; and the remaining groups are still not meeting. Total Group Contributions are starting to increase and we appreciate all the contributions being made so far this year and hope for continuing support.

### **Individual Contributions**

We are inspired and grateful that individual members of our community have made up for the shortfall in 2020 revenues in 2020 and early 2021. The large contributions in December 2020 and January 2021 (within the annual limit of \$5,000) helped to make us whole for the year. The larger contributions are expected to be a one-time thing. The "Hand of AA" event was a great success but we know that fund raising and group contributions may continue to be reduced in 2021.

We hope for ongoing individual support to make it through 2021.

### **Fundraisers**

Texas law allows 501c3 non-profit corporations like CBIA to have only two fundraiser events. This year's The Hand of AA spring fund raiser and a second event, Halloween Dance with raffles will be held to help support CBIA during 2021. We look forward to Jamboree again in 2022, February 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> at the Omni Hotel in Corpus Christi.


#### What Has the CBIA Board of Trustees Done?

We determined that we had previously reduced expenses as far as possible without cutting services, and we did not want to do that. We have also decided that to ensure the future of the organization it would be unwise to cover the entire shortfall from our prudent reserve.

However, the board decided to **move \$3,000 from Prudent Reserve** (*Savings*) **to Checking during the summer of 2020.** The board also voted to reduce hours & payroll by 25% so Kelly (AM) and Rita (PM) will work three hours rather than four each workday. As of April 7th, 2021, our hours are 8:30 – 11:30 AM and 2:00 – 5:00 PM Monday through Friday.

## What Can a Group Do to Help?

The AA World Service pamphlet, <u>Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix</u>, <u>suggests</u> that AA Groups in areas served by an intergroup office distribute funds in excess of prudent reserve as shown below.



Thus, it is up to each group conscience to determine what (if anything) it contributes.

Your group might want to re-consider its contribution priorities temporarily. GSO and Intergroup have a bigger slice of the pie because they have much higher overhead (*salaries*, *office space*, *etc*.) than the other service entities. You might want to consider giving more to Intergroup and GSO and less to other service entities. Also, if your group has money earmarked that can be sent in earlier, that would be helpful.


