

The speakers specified their Higher Power and spoke of their God moments with lots of fellowshipping that led late into the night. There were lots of fun games, lots of talk about old timer AA, and we even jumped in the lake! The printed program listed all the previous speakers for all 60 conferences and the history of the conference was shared throughout the weekend. The conference ended with Sunday morning with a service overlooking the lake. Will Jennifer attend this conference again? "Definitely!" she said.

Step 10 – Perseverance

Step 10: Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.

I think of the work in Steps 4-9 as a major spring housecleaning after years of neglect. Step 10 is like taking out the garbage every day so my life doesn't get so messy again. The principle behind Step 10 is **PERSEVERENCE.**

I like to do Step 10 at the end of the day with my iPhone / iPad Calendar. I look back over the day and see if I've kept my promises. Did I do what I said I would? Considering the days' activities, was I the sort of person my dog thinks I am, the sort of person I aspire to be? If not, I put it on my agenda for tomorrow to clean it up.

Step 10 makes it possible to live my life in day-tight compartments. Instead of dragging mistakes and slights from day to day, I can clean up after myself as I go. This is essential to living life one day at a time.

Progress for me has looked like this –

- Damn I did it again;
- Damn I'm doing it again; and ultimately
- I almost did it again.

Recently I heard someone say that she had a problem with lying and her sponsor said the next time you catch yourself lying, say **WHAT I JUST SAID IS A LIE**. Nothing will get you to quit lying quicker than that.

PROMPTLY means **RIGHT NOW**. It doesn't mean later after I've made up stuff about it and they've made up stuff about it. It is so much easier and so much more effective to do it now.

Part of this process for me is what I think of as the SLIPPERY SLOPE ALERT. The idea is if I don't go there, I won't have an out of control thinking binge.

- Don't compare my insides to other people's outsides.
- Don't take it personal until all other possibilities have been ruled out.
- Don't try to figure out other people's motives. (I have enough trouble figuring out my own motives and THAT would be useful.)
- Don't romance the idea of acting out (*telling them off; drinking; etc.*)
- Don't count the items in the next cart in the express check-out at HEB.

CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

Group Contributions

In the past, CBIA's second biggest source of revenue has been Group Contributions. Since COVID-19 came to this area in March of 2020, we have some groups that are starting to meet in person, others are still meeting only on Zoom; and the remaining groups are still not meeting. Total Group Contributions are starting to increase and we appreciate all the contributions being made so far this year and hope for continuing support.

Individual Contributions

We are inspired and grateful that individual members of our community have made up for the shortfall in 2020 revenues in 2020 and early 2021. The large contributions in December 2020 and January 2021 (*within the annual limit of \$5,000*) helped to make us solvent for the year. The larger contributions are expected to be a one-time thing. The "Hand of AA" event was a great success, and we will have an online raffle with a few baskets to raise money at the Halloween fundraiser event. This being said, we know that fund raising and group contributions may still be reduced in 2021.

We continue to hope for ongoing individual support to make it through 2021.

Fundraisers

Texas law allows 501c3 non-profit corporations like CBIA to have only two fundraiser events. This year's The Hand of AA spring fund raiser and the upcoming Halloween Dance with raffles will be held to help support CBIA during 2021. We look forward to Jamboree again in 2022-February 4rd-6th at the Omni Hotel in Corpus Christi.


What Has the CBIA Board of Trustees Done?

We determined that we had previously reduced expenses as far as possible without cutting services, and we did not want to do that. We have also decided that to ensure the future of the organization it would be unwise to cover the entire shortfall from our prudent reserve.

However, the board decided to move \$3,000 from Prudent Reserve (*Savings*) to Checking during the summer of 2020. The board also voted to reduce hours & payroll by 25% so Kelly (*AM*) and Rita (*PM*) will work three hours rather than four each workday. As of April 7th, 2021, our hours are 8:30 - 11:30 AM and 2:00 - 5:00 PM Monday through Friday.

What Can a Group Do to Help?

The AA World Service pamphlet, <u>Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix</u>, suggests that AA Groups in areas served by an intergroup office distribute funds in excess of prudent reserve as shown below.



Thus, it is up to each group conscience to determine what (if anything) it contributes.

Your group might want to re-consider its contribution priorities temporarily. GSO and Intergroup have a bigger slice of the pie because they have much higher overhead (*salaries, office space, etc.*) than the other service entities. You might want to consider giving more to Intergroup and GSO and less to other service entities. Also, if your group has money earmarked that can be sent in earlier, that would be helpful.



Birthday Club Members are people who have made an individual contribution to CBIA of \$1.00 or more for each year of sobriety during that calendar year. Helpline / 12 Step List-Help Needed! We are short people to answer the phones for the Helpline!

More people are needed for "The Helpline". The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who make sure the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day by answering the intergroup phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of six months sobriety is required to answer the phones. We need a few additional helpline volunteers at present. If you are available to do this vital volunteer work, please contact CBIA as soon as possible to add your name.

If a caller needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the **12-Step** List for a longer conversation on how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12 Step List. We especially need people (particularly women) in the outlying areas.

9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.

10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.

11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
