My name is Stephanie and I'm an alcoholic, my sobriety date is December 31st, 2013. As early as I can remember I have always felt different. I never really felt comfortable in my own skin, as if I didn't belong. I became addicted to escaping reality in my early teen years. Drinking was a great way for me to avoid having to feel any of the emotions that I was going through. Today I know it wasn't the drinking that was the problem, it has always been my thinking. Drinking helped me be okay with being shy, quiet, and insecure. When under the influence I became someone who was fearless but irresponsible at the same time. I suppose that's why they call it liquid courage. I was a regular Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde.

Once I had the first drink it was impossible to know exactly where or if it would end. After such occasions, I would make all sorts of resolutions to never do it again but those were promises I could never keep. There were times in the earlier days when I could clean up for special occasions or important dates but would always end with an even bigger explosion. Often, I'd stay up all night in a binge and neglect all my parental responsibilities the next day. In retrospect, I can see where God was taking care of me when I couldn't take care of myself. Everyone, including my kids, suffered as a result of my drinking. I had every intention on meeting my responsibilities as a mother, wife, and daughter but I just never had the ability once I put a drink in my body. I promised I would take the girls to school in the morning but time after time I wasn't able to because I was too drunk. Life with or around me was miserable for everyone, they never knew the Stephanie they were going to be with.

This cycle went on for years and this became the only way I knew how to function. One day I was looking in the mirror and couldn't recognize the person I had become. By this time, I had become very secretive about my consumption and would isolate as often as possible. I became a workaholic just so that I could be alone and drink as I pleased. I never wanted anyone to get too close to me out of fear that they would see right through my charade. I was very underweight and began worrying more and more about how I looked. It was getting to be more of a struggle to hide it from friends and family. Little did I know, this was the beginning of the end of my alcoholic life.

The bottom began to take shape with the collapse of my twelve-year relationship and custody battle for my two children. Domestic disputes and car accidents had become the norm. I was fortunate in that I never got any driving offenses even though I drove under the influence all the time. Looking back, I believe this was my higher power extending His grace. Out of all the many car accidents I had been in, getting rear ended at a light was going to prove to be the turning point I needed. It was from this accident that I was referred to Alcoholics Anonymous.

It took me another six months to hit another bottom hard enough that I finally decided to inquire about a meeting. One day I called the Coastal Bend Intergroup and they gave me the directions to Oso, which became my first home group. My first meeting was on a Tuesday night, I can remember being so scared to walk in but I did anyway. It was a first step meeting. As other people were sharing their stories, I had the sense that they all knew me personally. I felt very paranoid, almost like they had been watching me. I came to find out that they were speaking about themselves, it only sounded like my life because I was one of them. I wish I could say that I became a one chip wonder and never drank again, but I did not. A week or so later I chose to go back out and do some more research. I like to call this period my attempt at controlled drinking. In and out from April to December with a sponsor, I would not recommend this. I'm so grateful to my homegroup members for always telling me to keep coming back. By December I'd finally surrendered for the last time.

I owe my life to Alcoholics Anonymous and am grateful to its members, I finally feel like I found my herd. My sponsor and I would meet weekly at her home where she took me through the steps outlined in the Big Book Alcoholics Anonymous. It was suggested I go to meetings and do service work. Doing service work and having commitments in my home group helped me be accountable and feel a part of. She always told me to suit up and show up, I could never do this when I was drinking. I learned to be a productive member in AA as well as in society. I learned to be employable and responsible at my job, something I couldn't do before. I'm a full-time participant in my life today and in the lives of those around me.

Although life has become a blessing rather than a curse, I still must deal with the consequences of my drinking. Not everyone in my life has forgiven me but I'm hopeful and continue to do the best I can. I continue to make living amends to my family today and try to always do the next right thing. At eight years of sobriety, I'm still living one day at a time. Sometimes it's one moment at a time. I enjoy working with other women as my sponsor did with me and having the most meaningful relationships I've ever had with other members of our fellowship. Just like Bill did with Bob, this has helped me Through the darker parts of my sobriety. I have a partner in AA, and we have a beautiful daughter that has never seen either of us drunk. I know one thing for certain, if I were to pick up a drink today, I would start up right where I left off. I am and always will be an alcoholic. I truly believe we are the lucky ones, and for that reason I'll keep coming back. I've never had it so good, regardless of what my mind tells me.

May God bless us all, one day at a time.




What Has the CBIA Board of Trustees Done?

We continue to work reduced hours at the office to keep costs down. The hours & payroll are reduced by 25% so Terry (AM) and Rita (PM) will work three hours rather than four each workday. Our hours in 2022 continue at this time to be 8:30 - 11:30 AM and 2:00 - 5:00 PM Monday through Friday.

The board did decide after receiving the \$12,875.28 Jamboree contribution to move \$3,000 of that money back to the Prudent Reserve (Savings) from the check. The \$3000 was borrowed in the summer of 2020 to keep the office running during the Pandemic.

What Can a Group Do to Help?

The AA World Service pamphlet, <u>Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix</u>, <u>suggests</u> that AA Groups in areas served by an intergroup office distribute funds in excess of prudent reserve as shown below.



Thus, it is up to each group conscience to determine what (if anything) it contributes.

Your group might want to re-consider its contribution priorities temporarily. GSO and Intergroup have a bigger slice of the pie because they have much higher overhead (*salaries*, *office space*, *etc.*) than the other service entities. You might want to consider giving more to Intergroup and GSO and less to other service entities. Also, if your group has money earmarked that can be sent in earlier, that would be helpful.


