### Little bit of Jamboree history from James M.

It will be both an honor and a pleasure to be with you all tomorrow for your 69<sup>th</sup> Annual Jamboree. Made it as far as Edna when darkness and a cold misty fog counseled me into a motel, with some great Tex-Mex food next door.

This will be my 30th year being of service to the Coastal Band Jamboree. Some of you may wonder how a guy from Louisiana's Cajun Country wind up on your lovely Bay 500 miles from home? Well, here the story.

In 1992 I was taping the Gulf Coast Roundup in Biloxi, Mississippi, when a nice lady and I began conversing as she was buying a tape of the talk. The very lovely Ginny S. had been an active AA in Corpus Christi since the early 1970's. She related that she was visiting to take care of her ill mother, so I introduced her to some very active AA women of the area who took her under their wings until her mom departed. Isn't wonderful how AA embraces the traveler and the bereaved?

Back in the day and for almost two decades, I was the DJ for many a Saturday night dance at the events I also taped. Ginny asked me how much I charged and I told her nothing. I explained that the taping was an 8th Tradition special work and had been so recognized by Alcoholics Anonymous since tape recorders became available right after WW II ended in 1945. But that I was not a professional DJ, nor a professional sound man, nor a professional closed circuit TV man, so I provided these necessary services simply as an unpaid member of AA for fun and for free. Just as all of you do your various essential services on the Jamboree Committee also for fun & for free.

Some time went by and in the fall of '92, I got a call from one of the grandest AA ladies I have ever known, Mary Ann W. She had sobered in Pittsburgh in 1977, moved around Africa with her oil man husband doing 12 Step work in the darnedest places before settling in Corpus early 80's. For many years until her untimely passing in ten years ago, she and her running buddy Ginny were extremely active in AA, and in the Jamboree. Mary Ann was a powerful speaker and spoke at conferences all across the land.

She reminded me of my talks with Ginny in Mississippi and said the Jamboree needed a taper as Bud Smith from Houston was retiring. I was in New Orleans at the time and wondered why with so many tapers in Texas did she want me to drive 600+ miles? Simple, she said, you do sound and closed-circuit TV and DJ the dance for free. In Feb. 1993, I sojourned to the Holiday Inn, taped the speaker, handled the south, provided closed circuit TVs outside for the smokers (the Jamboree had just banned smoking, and there were almost 200 outside under the portico puffing away) and I DJ 'ed the dance, as I did for several years thereafter.

Thus began a wonderful journey with some of the most fabulous and interesting people a man could ask for. As they moved or passed on, others such as yourselves have stepped up to do God's work. Those days were good indeed, but make no mistake: These are the *Good Ole Days*!!!

So, I thank you for enriching my sobriety and my life these past **Thirty** Years. But as Paul Harvey used to say on the radio: "the rest of the story" is that I became your taper not through any great recording skills, but because I was a 'cheap date'.




### **CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support**



### **Helpline / 12 Step List-Help Needed!**

More people are needed for "The Helpline". The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who make sure the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day by answering the intergroup phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of nine months sobriety is required to answer the phones. If you are available to do this vital volunteer work, please contact CBIA as soon as possible to add your name.

If a caller needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the 12-Step List for a longer conversation on how to get sober and stay sober.
