A Member's Coastal Bender Story

I didn't like being a kid. In fact, I felt miserable, isolated, and discontented. I knew I was a misfit all my young life. The grownups seemed like they felt okay. And, they had all the authority. That's what I wanted. To feel normal and have authority. Translation: I wanted to be a big shot. Big-shot-itis is likely the primary cause and condition of my alcoholism!

I started drinking when I was fourteen, because that's what grownups did. And I smoked because they did that, too. I was a professional musician, often playing with a cigarette dangling from my mouth. I thought it made me look cool. And I drank for the same reason. Alcohol was available to members of the band, and I took advantage whenever possible. All that made me feel what I assumed to be what normal felt like for adults. Besides, liquid courage helped me play the big shot. I put on a great act, but still felt like a misfit.

It only got worse because it always gets worse for an alcoholic. Of course, I didn't know I was an alcoholic. Booze was my solution, not my problem. Wives were my problem. Employers were my problem. Other people were my problem. Alcohol had to nearly kill me before I could admit the problem was me. As the Big Book 1 tells us, liquor was but a symptom. (p. 64). Only two things stood between me and sobriety. One, I couldn't stop drinking. And two, I wanted nothing to do with AA. I had heard all about AA from my beer joint buddies. They didn't have many good things to say about the program or its members. So, I was less than happy when treatment counselors informed me meetings were mandatory.

Local AA members brought two meetings to the rehab. One meeting was in a building where smoking and real coffee were allowed. That meeting had a packed house every Friday night. A second, non-smoking, caffeine-free meeting was held in the group therapy room. Only a handful of people attended. I hadn't been outside the building since arriving Tuesday. Coffee and cigarettes were calling me. But I opted for the small meeting. It was directly across the hall from my room. I wouldn't have to run far to escape.

I was newly sober, but still wasn't playing with a full deck. I can't remember much about that meeting

except I recognize the man who chaired it. I still encounter him from time to time. He and I are both still sober. Amazing! I also remember something a woman shared. I wouldn't recognize her if we bumped into each other. Yet, she is my AA Angel, because she said she lost the compulsion to drink when she asked God to take it away. As I was still craving a drink as well as a cigarette, I thought to myself, "What have I got to lose?"

When the meeting ended, I slipped across the hall. I fell to my knees in that dark room. I can still remember the sensation of cold, hard tile. Sheepishly, I muttered, "If you're really there, God, please take from me the compulsion to drink." I didn't see a bright light, nor did I have a hot flash, as Bill W. has described 2. Instead, I felt warmth, comfort, and safety. It was as though I, as a small child, was being held in the arms of a safe parent.

In that instant, I knew I would never have to drink again. I also knew I would need to "come all the way in and sit all the way down" in Alcoholics Anonymous. I would have to get a sponsor and work the steps. And, I would have to recommit to sobriety each day and live only one day at a time, so the desire for a drink would not return.

That plan has worked for me for thirty-six years, or somewhere north of 13,000 days. Most important, by the grace of my Higher Power, I have not wanted, nor have I taken a drink since then. I am still an extreme example of self-will run riot 3 (p.62). But today, I don't need to be quite as much of a big shot. I'm happier just being another bozo on the bus. Thanks to God and the members of AA, I have a life worth living, for which I am grateful beyond measure.




CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

- 9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
- 11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
