Trudging the Road to Happy Destiny

I grew up in Corpus Christi and drinking was the norm. Just about everyone in my family drank. I lost a father in a car accident which was alcohol-related and don't remember him to this day. I do remember afterwards the fear that came over me at age 8, feeling estranged from my family and always thinking something bad was going to happen. The Doctor's Opinion talks about being restless, irritable, and discontented unless we can experience the sense of ease and comfort that alcohol brings. I had found myself in the Big Book. It pinned me to the wall. It was on me, and I needed a drink then! I also learned that I needed every drink to just be OK in my own skin.

The first ease and comfort I found was getting away with taking things that didn't belong to me and manipulating family members and strangers in the bars where Mother worked to earn a living for us. The first drink I took was at 14 years old and I remember the feeling of ease and comfort and warmth. I had arrived and I felt invincible. I also blacked out and had no clue what happened. Then there were years of rebellion and getting into trouble. I left home on my 17th birthday to start a drinking career that would last for 38 years. I don't want to go way into a drunkalogue but I had lots of relationships that were horribly sad and that left me with a lot of pain, guilt and shame, feeling that I was at fault.

When I got into AA I had no idea what I was against. I had low self-esteem and 100 forms of fear, internally fighting the idea of being a real alcoholic. I spent the first 5 years running on self-knowledge and self-reliance. I had a lot of preconceived ideas and misconceptions that were distorted. It kept me in ignorance. I hit my emotional bottom from just going to meetings and service. I kept coming back, going to meetings and working the best I could at the moment. I couldn't see the gift that my Higher Power was doing for me through other alcoholics. God's grace was keeping me sober through the struggles.

In 2017 I went full into Alcoholic Anonymous after another surrender. This time the sponsor was recommended from her experience of working the Big Book and being tough which is what I needed. Someone that would tell me the truth about alcoholism. We worked together for five years. She got me through the steps which saved me from destruction by my own hand. It also led me to working with others. Another challenge that took me to another dark bottom out of my own fears at 10 years; was my false belief of not doing a good enough job. I got to a place where I was trying to mimic my sponsor on sponsorship that led to being dishonest with her. Even through all of the challenges though, I kept coming back and started going out to local detox centers. I still go when I don't have other responsibilities and commitments.

I continue to work the steps every year with a sponsor, and work all three sides of the triangle: Unity, Service, and Recovery. Without all three I will perish. Thanks to AA I haven't found it necessary to pick up a drink since June 24, 2012. I attend a Big Book study meeting at 7 am and through reading it line by line I have found that the freedom and understanding of the Big Book is leading me to that happy destiny of freedom.

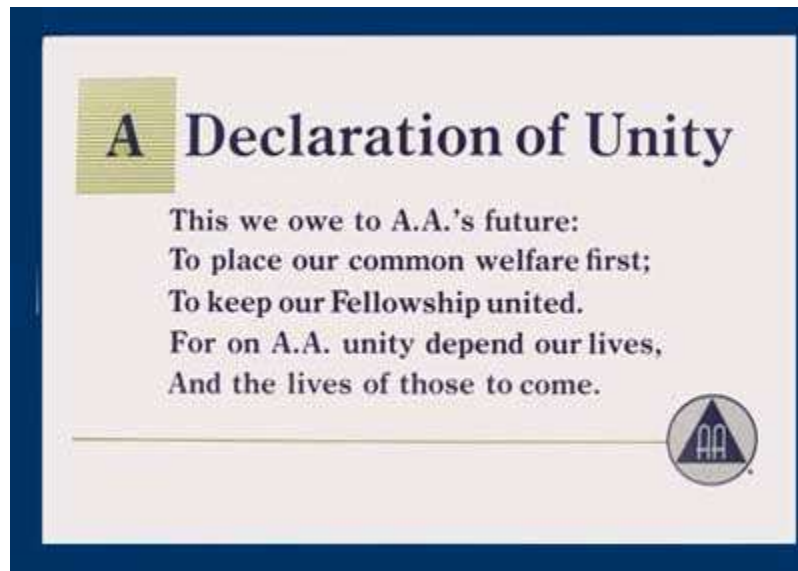

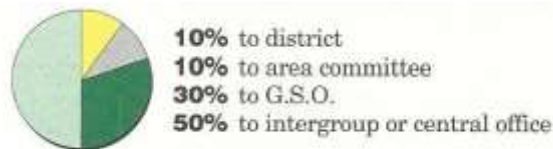


CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

Helpline / 12 Step List-Help Needed!

More people are needed for “The Helpline”. The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who make sure the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day by answering the intergroup phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of nine months sobriety is required to answer the phones. **If you are available to do this vital volunteer work, please contact CBIA as soon as possible to add your name.**

If a caller needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the **12-Step List** for a longer conversation on how to get sober and stay sober.
