November is AA’s gratitude month, a time to reflect on the gift of sobriety and consider **“how I can give back?”**. One important option is to donate to the Coastal Bend Intergroup Association (CBIA). CBIA provides a vital doorway to AA for the still-suffering alcoholic. **What does CBIA do?** Glad you asked!

CBIA maintains an office which provides information and referrals for AA inquiries; maintains a 12 Step list and calls AA members for 12 Step work; provides a 24-hour helpline manned by volunteers in the evenings, on weekends and holidays; publishes meeting schedules; publishes this monthly newsletter; purchases and sells anniversary medallions and sobriety chips and conference approved literature; and maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend. With this in mind, CBIA provides a Step 1 conduit-to-AA for those lost in the throes of alcoholism and, also importantly, a Step 12 and Tradition 7 opportunity for active AA members.

Did you know that: CBIA is funded entirely by individual member and group contributions as well as a limited number of fundraisers such as the Halloween Dance, the New Year’s Bash, and the Jamboree. The Birthday Plan is for members who wish to contribute to CBIA on their A.A. birthday. \$1 per year of sobriety is suggested but any amount is helpful. Join the Birthday Plan and get your name in the Bender! **Of the 78 groups in the Coastal Bend with 292 meetings, only about 28 contribute to CBIA.**

Contributions to CBIA are at about the same level as last year. Meanwhile, expenses have gone up.

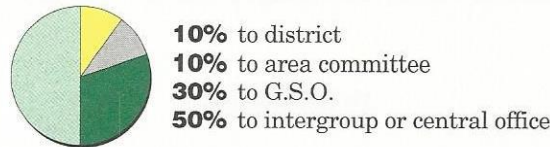


CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

You might want to consider giving more to Intergroup and GSO and less to other service entities. Also, if your group has money earmarked that can be sent in earlier, that would be helpful.

More people are needed for “The Helpline”. The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who make sure the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day by answering the intergroup phones overnight (5 PM to 8 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday or 8 AM Sunday to 8 AM Monday). A minimum of nine months sobriety is required to answer the phones. **If you are available to do this vital volunteer work, please contact CBIA as soon as possible to add your name.**

If a caller needs help beyond meeting information, the helpline passes them to someone on the **12-Step List** for a longer conversation on how to get sober and stay sober. A minimum of two years sobriety is required to be on the 12 Step List. If interested please call Terry or Rita at the CBIA office (361) 992-8911 between 8:30-11:30 AM or 2-5 PM Monday thru Friday.
