## Trusting God In My Sober Decisions

Having just completed my third successful interview with a National Restaurant chain, I was eager to tell my just acquired sponsor and new sober friends the good news. So much had changed in the past few months from being fired from my last job, adjusting to my latest relationship that started with our meeting in my “Home Bar”, named The Bitter End. I was staying sober, and she continued to drink just like we used to. There were 6 of us, all newly sober, all of whom I met attending meetings at The Southside Club in Dayton Ohio. We went to the same meetings, spent hours at Denny’s late into the evening listening, laughing and supporting one another. We shared our stories on how we got here, our sponsors and the challenges we all faced one day at a time. They were excited about the news of my recent job interview since I was currently unemployed and running out of resources. They all supported my decision to move into a small furnished apartment away from my still drinking partner.

We all had assignments at The Southside Club given to us by our sponsors. Mine was making sure the ashtrays in front of every seat were empty and the white porcelain coffee cups were clean. There were two distinct designated seating areas. On the left was “smoking”, on the right was “chain smoking”. Usually, halfway through a meeting, you had to lower your head below the smoke cloud to see the speaker. There was one large meeting room, a kitchen area and a small entrance space with an old couch, This small area had a pay phone on the wall and was properly designated The Half Measures Room. People still not quite sure they had what it takes to cease dropping the pull tab into their can of beer would sit and listen to someone who had. Hope was often found there and however hesitant at first to enter the BIG room with the ashtrays, sometimes would result in another newbie, just like me.

The phone call from the Restaurant Corporate offices offering me the position was financially below what I was expecting, so in a moment of haste, turned the position down. I headed for the couch in The Half Measures Room and while contemplating my decision, Jim, my sponsor walked in. After explaining to him they didn’t offer me what I was worth, he asked me how much I was currently earning. I said “Jim, you know I’m not working now” and his response was so, if your self-worth is financially based, right now your worth nothing, is that correct?” Hesitantly I got up off the couch, dropped a quarter in the pay phone and called the restaurant office. After several minutes of hesitation, they agreed to hire me. So now what? How was I going to afford my new truck payments, my child support payments and all the other expenses? My sponsor, Jim reminded me if I remembered what I did when I took the 3rd step. By turning my will and my life over to the God of my understanding, I needed to include Him in ALL aspects of my new sober life.

I went home, got on my knees and asked for help in my thoughts and actions. Later that day, I explained it to my newbie group at Denny’s. We all joined hands and asked God to help me in my new adventure. It’s amazing how I felt driving home that whatever my future held, if God was at the center of my decisions and my sponsor was close by, I could handle wherever I was headed. In order to stay within my new budget, I was going to give back my new truck and move into the YMCA in downtown Dayton, Ohio. I had about \$600 to buy a car and got really excited at the prospect of where I was going to live and also what fun I would have trying to keep the fenders on my vehicle. My previous negative attitude disappeared as I worked through the details keeping God and Jim close by. The Saturday before I was starting my new position, I was on my way to drop off my truck when I stopped at the mailbox. The handful of junk mail was on the seat next to me and at a traffic light noticed a letter from the restaurant corporate offices. Thinking it was just a standard welcome letter, I almost didn’t open it. Tearing the letter open, I had to pull over as tears were blurring my vision. I read the letter again and

again, ever slowly as the words I was reading finally sunk in. The corporate letter said that after reviewing my work experience and qualifications they were starting me out 3 pay grades higher than what had been quoted. That was way above what my “old self-worth” was. My hands were still shaking as I turned into The Southside Club and headed for the Half Measures Couch. God knew but wasn’t talking. He didn’t utter a word about the pay grade stuff. He was waiting to see if I really meant my prayers. This was my very first experience in truly trusting Him in all my sober life and wouldn’t you know it, one of those beer can pull tab people just happened to be sitting next to me on the couch. Wow, my first 12th step venture. They heard an earful that day.

**P.S. The Rest of The Story**

My position was director of restaurant maintenance for over 350 ice cream restaurants in 13 states whose Midwest corporate office was also the location where all the ice cream was made. The production overruns were offered free to employees who had a worthwhile cause. Once a month I would grab 3 volunteer Southside newbies and load the entire back of my pickup truck with ½ gallon ice cream of all flavors, frozen cakes and novelties and head out on our pre-determined rout of single sober moms, and sober families who were struggling and try to get it all delivered before it melted. Exhausted and on the way back to the Half Measures Room, we would all be smiling at how much joy can be found in just giving.

**That was in 1982 and that is how I was known as “Ice Cream Dave”**

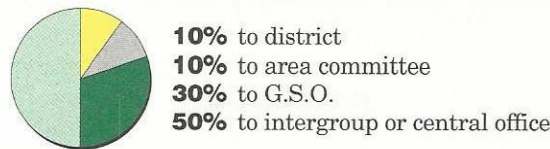


## CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

8. Purchases and sells "CONFERENCE APPROVED" literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.
9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
