Is it a truth that one cannot accurately judge any situation unless one knows the outcome of it, say a week from now or a year from now? Can we know the future? Or can we know what would have happened if things had been different? If not, can we adequately judge circumstances as good or bad? Sometimes the greater truths are best revealed in little stories, which the more highly educated dismiss as nonsense or children’s tales.

Here is a little story.

Once upon a time, before time was time, in a far-off country, there lived all alone in a small hut a poor girl whose name was Jayda. Walking in the woods one day, Jayda saw that a colony of bees had abandoned their honey. So, she decided to collect it. “I will take the honey to the farmer’s market and sell it, and try to improve my life with the money I’ll get”, she told herself. Jayda ran home and brought a jar which she filled with the honey. But she did not know that the reason for her poverty was a malicious genie who tried all he could to prevent her from making anything a success. The genie woke up as something told him that Jayda was starting to do something useful, and he rushed to the spot, intent on causing trouble. As soon as he saw Jayda with the honey, he turned himself into a branch on a tree and snagged her arm, so that the jar fell and broke. He laughed and laughed as the honey seeped into the ground. “This will infuriate her”, he cackled to himself as the branch swung back and forth. But Jayda just looked at the honey and said to herself, “Oh well, the ants will eat the honey and perhaps something will come of it”. She had seen a line of ants whose scouts were already tasting the honey to see if it was useful to them. As she started to walk through the woods back to her hut, she saw a man on horseback was coming toward her. When he was only a few yards away, he idly raised his whip and struck at a tree in passing. Jayda saw that it was a mulberry tree, and the blow had made the ripe purple berries shower to the ground. She thought, “That’s a good idea. I’ll collect mulberries and take them to the market to sell. Perhaps something will come of it”. The mean-spirited genie saw her collecting the fruit and laughed to himself. When Jayda had filled her basket, he turned himself into a donkey and quietly followed her all the way to the market town. When she sat down to rest, the genie in the form of a donkey edged up to her, nuzzling her arm. Jayda stroked his nose, and then the horrid beast suddenly rolled over onto the basket of mulberries, crushing them to a pulp. The juice ran all over the road, and the genie-ass gleefully galloped away into the bushes. Jayda looked at the purpled mess in dismay. At that moment, however, the Queen had been approaching, on her way to the capital.

“Stop at once.”, she ordered her coachmen. “For that poor girl has lost everything. Her donkey has squashed her fruit and run off. She will be ruined if we do not help her”. So, the Queen took Jayda with her in her coach, and they became fast friends. She gave Jayda a house, and Jayda soon became a successful merchant in her own right. When he saw how well Jayda was doing, the genie had a good look at her house to see what he could do to ruin her. He realized that she kept all her goods in a warehouse behind the house. So, he set fire to the house and the good, and the place was burned to the ground in almost less time than it takes to tell. Jayda had run out of the house when she smelled the smoke. She looked at the ruins with sorrow. Then she noticed that a line of tiny ants was forming, and then that they were carrying their stocks of corn, one grain at a time, from beneath the house to a place of greater safety. To help them, Jayda lifted a large stone covering their nest. Beneath it gushed a spring of water! As Jayda tasted it, the people of the town gathered around her and cried, “The Water of Life! This is what has been foretold!”

And that is how Jayda became known as the Princess of the Water of Life, which she still tends, and which can be drunk by those seek it. 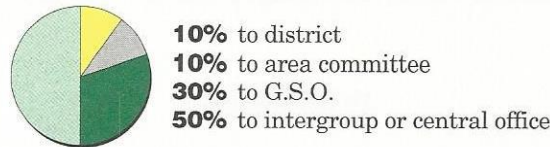


CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support
