My name is Rich, and I'm an Alcoholic.

I came into AA first through another fellowship for my drug addiction. Even though I knew I was a drug addict, I avoided going to meetings because I heard they wouldn't let you drink. Giving up both drugs and booze was not something I was willing to do, until in December 1993 my addiction was so desperate that I called a hotline and committed to going to my first 12 step meeting.

I was told that if I kept drinking and using, there were only three things that would happen to me: (1) I would die of an overdose. (2) I would end up in jail, and (3) I would wind up in an institution with no brains. When I heard that, I broke down crying and I went to my first meeting the very next day. When I was told I could not drink, I was willing to take that advice, for at least the first few days. Although, in my mind, I was only a drug addict, not an alcoholic!

One of the things that surprised me at my first meeting is that people were laughing and having a good time. I thought that going to a meeting was a desperate depressing place for losers. It was that laughter and knowing that these people had overcome their addictions that gave me hope. When I surrendered at my first 12 step meeting, I was willing to go to any length to stay sober. For the first time, I asked for help and was willing to take advice.

I confess to having a lazy streak. At first, I thought I would just go to meetings and not bother with the steps. But by the grace of God, I realized that the individuals who had what I wanted were all working the steps. I decided to take directions. I got a sponsor. I started working the steps with my sponsor. By honestly working the steps, I soon learned I truly am an alcoholic.

In my first 90 days of sobriety my cravings were so intense I didn't trust myself to stay sober on my own. I went to two meetings every day. A 5:30 am meeting and an evening meeting. That kept me safe before and after work. I took commitments at every meeting I could. I didn't feel safe alone so, I relied on my new AA friends to help me by using the phone and hanging out with me during my vulnerable times.

By working the twelve steps I learned that I was selfish and self-centered. I learned how to deal with my resentments. I learned to pray for others. I learned to be of service.

When I came into AA at 38 years old, I had a ton of credit card debt, I owed

the IRS \$15,000 in back taxes and I was living at home with my parents. My car was a wreck, and I had no money in savings.

Thanks to the Big Book of Alcoholics anonymous, my sober friends in AA, and the by grace of God, my life is totally different today. I was able to reboot my career, and then, with 30 years of sobriety I was able to retire from my corporate job and enjoy the many gifts of sobriety including my wife of 22 years and a second career as a professional magician. I live a fun life. I'm doing the things I only used to dream about.

Before AA, I used to think being sober was a condition to avoid at all cost. I've since learned sobriety is my most precious gift an alcoholic can have. I am not cured of alcoholism. What I have is a daily reprieve contingent on my spiritual condition one day at a time.

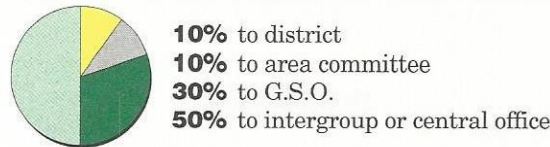


CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

Services Provided

1. Maintains an office which is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 11:30AM and 2:00 to 5:00PM.
2. Provides information and referrals for A.A. inquiries.
3. Maintains a 12 Step listing and calls individuals for 12 Step work.
4. Provides an A.A. listing in the Telephone directory.
5. Provides a 24-hour volunteer phone answering during hours when the office is closed.
6. Publishes meeting schedules of all groups in the Coastal Bend Area at no charge.
7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal Bender", to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.
8. Purchases and sells "CONFERENCE APPROVED' literature, and non-conference approved Anniversary Medallions, Sobriety Chips.
9. Conducts monthly Trustee meetings. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings and Group Input is essential.
10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs.
11. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
