Two Years

It started out when I was young, just a little child, I laid awake alone at night while you were running wild. I was just six or seven when I picked up my first drink, I didn't know if I liked it and I didn't know what to think

My parents drank day and night. Took their abuse on me. I didn't know right from wrong, just expected it to be. My father was sexually abusive and he beat me every day. I prayed to God every night that he would go away.

He used to hit my mother too and used to make her cry. He told us that he hated us and wished that we would die. I started drinking everyday around the age of ten. They left their half full glasses so I'd drink them up again.

The pain was so bad it hurt inside; all I'd do was cry. I'd pray to God every night and wish that I would die. My father left when I was eight. Glad to see him go. He left my mother to care for me but things were getting worse. She just couldn't see that I would have to see my Dad. The courts had made me so the abuse never stopped.

But at thirteen the visitation was put to an end. I didn't have a father, just one who wanted to be a friend. So, then I started smoking pot and using cocaine. I never knew in time it would make me so insane. In the beginning it was great, I didn't have to feel. Everything was wonderful but none of it was real.

No father in my life, but my mother she still drank. The more and more she did that, the more and more we sank. She gave me everything I wanted so our relationship could mend. I wanted my mother back; I didn't want a friend. I wanted a hug and "I love you too". I always thought that in my mind parents knew just what to do.

I was drinking and drugging like an addict would. I wasn't really happy but it sure made me feel good. My mother got a boyfriend who treated her with class. He really didn't like me much because I was such an ass. He helped slow down her drinking and soon she was okay. I get down on my knees and I thank God for that day!

Finally, I was happy, my mother was around. And I was happy for her for the new life that she found. Things were getting worse for me, I thought that I was cool. Overdosed in college and was thrown out of school.

Drugs and drinks were getting worse, my mental state was gone. They put me in the psych ward on and on and on. Always in trouble ending up in jail. No one cared, they left me there without no bail. I'd go into a rehab thinking I would stay but then I'd make a phone call and I'd be on my way.

I started smoking crack, that's when things got bad. I lost everyone I loved and everything I had. I sold my body for drugs and begged for money on the street. I had nowhere to sleep at night or anything to eat.

I've never felt so lost inside or never felt such pain. I truly now had lost my mind; I truly am insane. A father that abused me, boyfriends who did too, all the drugs and alcohol couldn't fix the pain I've been through.

Jails, institutions, death, we'll keep that in mind, because though you may not seek it, it's you that they will find. I have a mental illness as well as this disease. But I have the capacity to be honest and that puts my heart at ease.

I have come into this program at my bottom angry as hell. On my hands and knees, wanting to get well. When my mother passed away just 5 years ago, I thought my life was over and there was no place left to go.

And after 16 years someone left me all alone. He doesn't even see me or call me on the phone.

I cut my wrists, my blood so red, I wished that I was dead. AA was always there for me, so sad I was, so weak. But I knew when I walked through those doors, I wouldn't have to drink.

They gave me strength beyond belief, I was strong and I was tough. Though the road there was rocky and rough.

Now I live with open arms and a hug and an embrace. And look back upon the days the problems that I faced. I'm able to live my life through the people of AA. I don't have to cry each night; I only have to pray.

I've given my life up to God to do with as he will and he has given life back to me. Much more than my fill.

I grew throughout this year as I have learned to cope. The strength AA has given me has given me new Hope.

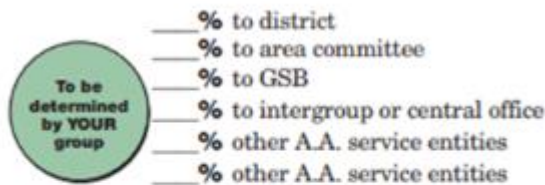

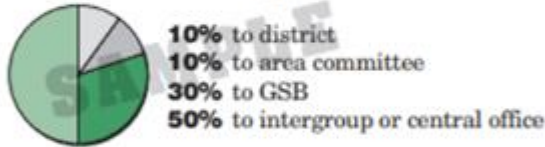
CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

Samples of Group Contributions to A.A. Service Entities

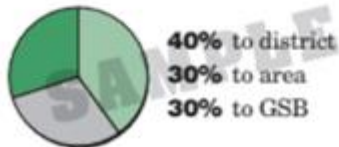
