Holiday parties without liquid spirits may still seem a dreary prospect to new A.A.s. But many of us have enjoyed the happiest holidays of our lives sober—an idea we would never have dreamed of, wanted, or believed possible when drinking. Here are some tips for having an all-round ball without a drop of alcohol.



1 Line up extra A.A. activities for the holiday season. Arrange to take newcomers to meetings, answer the phones at a clubhouse or central office, speak, help with dishes, or visit the alcoholic ward at a hospital.



2 Be host to A.A. friends, especially newcomers. If you don't have a place where you can throw a formal party, take one person to a diner and spring for the coffee.



3 Keep your A.A. telephone list with you all the time. If a drinking urge or panic comes—postpone everything else until you've called an A.A.



4 Find out about the special holiday parties, meetings, or other celebra-

tions given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.



5 Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.



6 If you have to go to a drinking party and can't take an A.A. with you, keep some candy handy.



7 Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.



8 Worship in your own way.



9 Don't sit around brooding. Catch up on those books, museums, walks, and letters.



10 Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember—"one day at a time."



11 Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts—but this year, you can give love.



12 "Having had a . . ." No need to spell out the Twelfth Step here, since you already know it.

Happy Holidays

I thought of myself as a late bloomer because I didn't start drinking until I was sixteen. Most of my friends in our beach city had started drinking for fun a couple of year earlier. I didn't drink every day. But I noticed right away that I drank differently from my friends. They would go out, do a little drinking, and then go home. But when I drank, I drank a lot and didn't stop until I was completely drunk and crazy.

I knew this was a problem and I was able to stop drinking for a few years. I got into good college and things were going well. At age twenty-two, a girlfriend left me, and little by little I started drinking beer again. Soon it was back to the same thing. Every time I drank, I would drink way too much, and usually get in trouble. I started getting arrested. The charges were always drinking-related – open container violations, drunk in public, and DWI.

I couldn't hold a job. I would get a good job, then take weeks off to surf and drink, drink and surf. This went on for four or five years until I found myself in a deep depression. I was introduced to cocaine, and the drinking became fun again for a while. I used the cocaine in order to keep drinking.

Then at age thirty-four I was arrested one more time for DUI. This time a passenger in my car was holding ecstasy, pot, and coke. I was charged with possession and sentenced to a drug diversion program. All I had to do was go to the classes and pass a little test. But I was still drinking and failed to complete the program. This resulted in my being arrested for violating the terms of my sentence - failing the drug classes and continuing to drink. I told the judge that I had tried to stop drinking but just couldn't quit. I didn't know why I couldn't stop even when I really wanted to.

I was sentenced to two weeks in jail and another drug diversion program, although because of my previous failure, I was not supposed to be eligible. At the end of my two weeks, I was feeling scared. I was due to be released from jail and all I could think about was drinking again. I knew this would end badly and I knew I was going to drink anyway. I told this to one of the jailers. He told me that when I got out, I should go to an AA meeting. I was really afraid of what would happen if I drank again, so I found an AA meeting in another beach town.

At this meeting, the speaker at the podium seemed to be talking directly to me. I identified with his story, and the pain and terror of knowing I was going to go do the same things over and over, but having no power to quit. I heard him say that in AA he had found a way out. I was struck with a sudden epiphany that my life was shattered because of drinking, and that if this man could get sober and stay sober, so could I. I imagined myself free to go surfing again and to live with all the freedom I'd felt when I was fourteen. I was told to get a sponsor, so I asked the speaker to be my sponsor. I did the work that was asked of me. I didn't realize how that would pay off until a few years later.

I was clean and sober for several years, when I had an accident and broke my arm. At that time the doctors were prescribing a new drug, oxycontin, for pain relief. After only a few days of taking it, I knew I was becoming addicted. I kept taking it, and soon started drinking again. The trouble started immediately. I had a car wreck while drunk with an open container in the car. I just knew I was done for this time. But God loves a drunk. The cops let me go!

On June 5, 2008 I came crawling back to AA, sick and tired of being sick and tired. I remembered what that speaker at my first AA meeting had said. There was a way out. I got a sponsor right away and began working the steps. I did a fourth and fifth step which freed me of the resentments and fears I'd been carrying.

I kept right on going. For five years I went to seven meetings a week. I took service commitments, began sponsoring others. I started traveling the world sober, surfing and hitting AA meetings all over Australia, Indonesia, Asia, and central and South America.

Today I have my meetings, which I attend regularly where I live at Sunset Beach, Hawaii. I have my sponsor and a group of friends like none I've ever had before. I get to cry in front of them and be sad and grateful for a life God has given me so freely.

I was diagnosed with prostate cancer, and I took my program into my radiation treatment. I learned the names of patients worse off than me greeted the staff and learned their name. In short, I brought the best version of Matt into the clinic every day. Today I know true meaning of living in the now. The words from the big book ring truer to me today than when I first read them: We will know a new freedom and a new happiness.

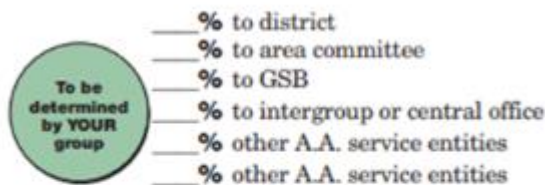

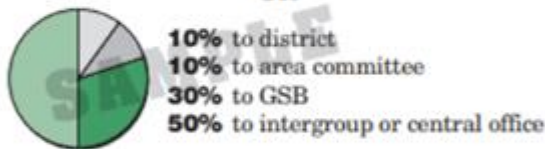

Samples of Group Contributions to A.A. Service Entities

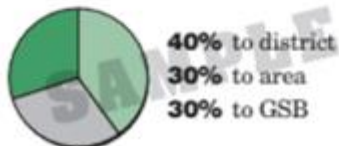
