My Story AA

My name is Laure and I'm an alcoholic. My sobriety date is October 21, 1984.

I grew up in a beach town in southern California where a lot of wealthy and elite people live. My family lived comfortably, but not compared to a lot of kids at my school. I always felt different, like I didn't fit in. One of my parents was a full-blown alcoholic. The other one didn't express their feelings. I didn't bring any other kids home because I never knew what it was going to be like at home. I felt very isolated and alone, and had no friends until I discovered drugs and alcohol in junior high. By using drugs and alcohol I started making lots of friends. We did a lot of things that I thought were fun. This drinking and drugging went on for about fifteen years, until I found myself at age thirty.

Truly my last few years of drinking and using had started to take a toll within me. Slowly but surely my soul felt like it was fading away. I was hanging out with some very shady, very scary people. The drugs were taking a toll and I was drinking myself into blackouts. I would put on an emotional mask and pretend to be whatever I thought you wanted me to be, not realizing that I was selling my soul and losing myself more and more.

I recognized that I had an addiction, but I didn't recognize that I was an alcoholic. Knowing nothing about the program of recovery, and not knowing how to change anything, I felt like I was close to the bottom.

At that time, I had been being secretly 12 stepped for probably a year by a coworker, although I had no clue that's what they were doing. One Monday I came to work complaining that my boyfriend had gone on a three-day binge without me and I was totally incensed. How dare he? I needed a new boyfriend!

This was the opening my friend needed and she suggested there were all kinds of great guys at this place she knew, and we could go there the next evening. She did tell me the guys didn't drink or use. My warped mind told me, "Oh good. I can find a new boyfriend and have them buy me all the stuff I need to continue the party".

Well, I went with her and, of course, it was an AA meeting. Well, I had just a single tear going down my face through the whole meeting. What I connected to was the spirit and love and compassion in the room, the real laughter. The tissues given to somebody who is crying. The holding of their hands or hugging them. It broke my heart open.

The seed was planted that night, but I wasn't ready. It took me a few more months. But I kept coming back, not sober, but still coming. Until one Sunday I experienced the pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization that we read about in the Big Book. The meeting I had been going to was on a Tuesday night. I decided to commit to three days of sobriety. That meant the previous Monday which I was too hungover to drink was day 1. So, I was well into my second day already. I only had one more to go and I thought I could tough that out, and I did. I woke up on day four and decided I'd try it again. I kept hearing about this AA Young People's conference in Crestline, which is a mountain community in southern California. It was happening in a couple weeks and I wanted to go, so I decided to, just one day at a time, stick it out till then. I had been hearing things in the meetings- like keep coming back" work the steps or die, turn it over, and do the footwork but leave the results to your higher power. Well,

there was snow predicted in Crestline that weekend. I needed boots to wear and I was dead broke. I could only spare \$5.00 for boots. I was working on the higher power idea, but I wasn't really guite sure about anything and really didn't have a higher power, of my own understanding. But I decided to try turning it over, whatever that means. I took a drive looking for shoe stores while saying prayers to my higher power. These prayers had many conditions, like, if you really want me to go to this thing, then you need to find me some f-ing boots for five dollars.

I knew there was no way that was going to happen, but I was out to prove these AA people were wrong about a higher power in my life. That the concept of turning it over by doing the footwork and leaving the rest to the higher power wouldn't work, right? As I was driving down a busy street there was a shoe store with a big sign outside that said sale. OK, my footwork was to go into the store and find a pair of boots for five dollars. I walked in, went to the women's section, and saw no boots for five dollars. This just proved there wasn't a God or higher power.

As I was walking out, the sales guy said, hey, how can I help you? I proceeded to tell him I needed a pair of boots for five dollars. He asked what size? I told him. He said, "Well, we have a sale on boy's boots. I think I can fit you in a boy's size 7". I tried them on and they fit perfectly. I asked him how much it was and he said five dollars. Really? Maybe this AA thing might be right after all. So, I went to the Crestline conference with less than 30 days of sobriety. I was one of the brand newcomers. Many others there had 1 to 10 years of sobriety. They were all young people like me, and they were all wild and crazy- and clean and sober!

That weekend changed my life. These people became my tribe, my friends, my mentors and I still go to meetings with many of these people once a week on zoom. I'm still a newcomer at 40 years sober. We're still sober and that test of faith proved that a higher power worked in my life. That was the beginning of my relationship with a higher power of my understanding. I have been blessed and graced and grateful all these years. Plus, I still have the boots. I usually wear them when I share as an AA speaker.

Slowly but surely, that broken heart that cracked open to have the seed planted has mended and is whole again. My sobriety is truly one day at a time sobriety, and I wouldn't want it any other way.





Helpline Help Needed!
