Accepting the Gift of Sobriety

I had been sober only a month or two and was riding my motorcycle to a Saturday morning meeting. Riding my bike was one of the few pleasures I still enjoyed in the depths of my alcoholism.

I was extremely skeptical of the whole "God" thing because of my early religious experience. Tired of white knuckling it, I had reluctantly taken my group's advice, and dropped to my knees to ask God to remove the desire to drink. While it had worked, I was still in no way a "grateful" alcoholic thinking it was a psychological trick. I had large financial and marital problems, and was still spiritually bankrupt.

As I exited a banked 90-degree curve at about 60 miles an hour. I heard my back tire pop and the rear of the bike swerved wildly from side to side. Somehow, I was able to get the bike to the side of the road without losing control and crashing.

Even at 9:00 in the morning it was extremely hot and humid. It rained the night before and it felt like steam was coming out of the ground. Although there was a motorcycle shop about a quarter-mile away I cursed my luck as I pushed the bike through the loose gravel on the shoulder. I was drenched in sweat when I finally got to the motorcycle shop.

They said they could put a new tube in the bike tire for \$10. \$10 was all the money I had and I swore under my breath as I gave it to them.

I started to hitchhike to the meeting and couldn't understand why no one picked me up. I wasn't even aware of my appearance, ignoring the fact that I had shoulder length hair, a long scruffy beard and wasn't exactly dressed well. I started cursing, gave up and began to walk.

Hot, tired, and angry, I walked on a culvert to cross a small swampy area. Suddenly a bird song broke through my foul mood. I looked over to see a red winged blackbird just singing his heart out, perched on a cattail about 10 feet away. Out of nowhere an old verse from my childhood Bible school came into my head, "God takes care of the smallest sparrow in the field, why wouldn't he take care of you."

All of a sudden, I was overwhelmed with gratitude. I felt grateful that I hadn't crashed my bike and been severely injured or killed. I was grateful that there was a motorcycle shop nearby. I was grateful I had \$10. Most of all I was grateful to be sober. I suddenly realized that God really was watching out for me.

After trudging hot, angry and resentful, I had a massive change of heart. My step quickened, my mood lightened, my worries lifted and I transformed to being happy and grateful. Ten minutes later I entered the meeting and somebody commented that I had a smile on my face in contrast to my usual dour self. This small bird, a perfect expression of God, reassured me that he would indeed help me through all my difficulties if I just stayed sober and walked the AA path.



Helpline Help Needed!

- Establish a 24-hour helpline;
- Maintain & print meeting schedules;
- Maintain a 12-Step list whereby AA groups and individuals are able to conduct 12-Step calls which are essential to the growth of AA in the Coastal Bend area.

Services Provided

- 1. Maintains an office open Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 11:30AM and 2:00 to 5:00PM.
- 2. Provides information and referrals for A.A. inquiries.
- 3. Maintains a 12 Step listing and calls individuals for 12 Step work.
- 4. Provides an A.A. listing in the telephone directory and on the internet.
- 5. Provides a 24-hour volunteer helpline during hours when the office is closed.
- 6. Maintains & publishes current meeting schedules in the Coastal Bend Area.
- 7. Publishes a monthly newsletter, the "Coastal BENDER," to keep A.A. members informed of local A.A. affairs and special events.
- 8. Purchases and sells conference-approved literature and non-conference-approved anniversary medallions & sobriety
- 9. Conducts monthly Board of Trustees meetings.
- 10. Conducts Quarterly Meetings to keep groups apprised of Intergroup activities, and to seek group participation in CBIA affairs. All members of Alcoholics Anonymous are welcome at these meetings since group input is essential.
- 11. Maintains a current website, cbiaa.org.
- 12. Maintains service committees for service work in the Coastal Bend Area.
