Many out of towners canceled reservations at the hotel and called to say they were sorry to miss our event but couldn't take the chance to drive down. Jamboree Speakers kicked off on Friday night at 5:00pm as usual and after the 8:00pm Speaker there was Sing Along Bingo with Dave W. and Don K. It was a fun time, and some great prizes were won. The new Friday night 10pm meeting had a few people in attendance, next year might be bigger? The Fun Run, new to the event, started on Saturday morning at 8:15 am but then the cold front blew in about 20 minutes later, making for a brisk and wet run. The Silent Auction room was full of items to bid on and there was a lot going on in there. Archives room was hosted by Dave D., Frank W. and John K. They reported they had many visitors to the room and were happy to get to visit with many. There were plenty of Raffle baskets this year (thank you Amanda!), so many that she took the losing tickets and threw them together in a bin on some raffles with a bonus basket! Saturday afternoon was full of meetings. Meetings for Al Anon, Old Timers and ACOA were available to everyone! The 8pm Speaker meeting was followed by music by the band Anonymity. They sounded awesome. Sunday morning finished with In Memoriam, Sobriety Countdown, and the 10am Speaker. We missed you if you didn't make it. Until next time.....

**The Jamboree Committee was able to donate \$5587.36 this year toward the operation of the Coastal Bend Intergroup Association, much less than many other years. It is our hope that our community will continue to support CBIA, through Group and Individual contributions, so that CBIA can continue its mission of carrying the message by providing meeting schedule information and our 24-hour Helpline and 12 Step List. **News from New York.....**

**General Service Office Quarterly Report (Q4 2025)**

The General Service Board met November 3, 2025, in New York City. Committees reported on service efforts supporting archives, corrections, public information, literature, international services, and technology. Updates included revisions to archival policies and workbooks, improvements to Cooperation with the Professional Community materials, and continued outreach efforts within correctional facilities.

Financially, contributions were below budget year-to-date, while literature sales exceeded projections. Operating expenses remain under budget, and the Reserve Fund stands at approximately 6.2 months of operating expenses. Trustees emphasized continued communication to the Fellowship regarding self-support and prudent financial stewardship.

Publishing updates include continued development of the Plain Language Big Book, including tools explaining how proposed changes are reviewed and assessed. Bulk book discounts and other pricing initiatives were also implemented to support groups and service entities. AA Grapevine and La Viña reported improved financial performance compared to 2024, driven by growth

in digital subscriptions, apps, and podcast engagement. Intergroups and central offices may now partner with Grapevine and La Viña to offer subscriptions locally, earning a commission while supporting outreach.

International committees continue preparations for upcoming World Service Meetings and ongoing review of licensing and translation efforts. Technology teams reported improvements to the Meeting Guide app and data integrity systems supporting more accurate communication across the Fellowship. Facsimile copies of the First Edition Big Book have been permanently discontinued. According to AAWS via direct phone communication, no additional printing is planned.

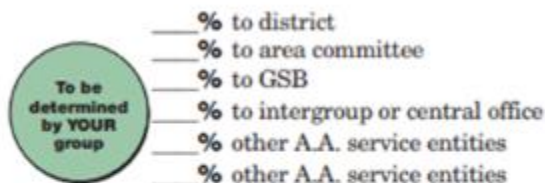

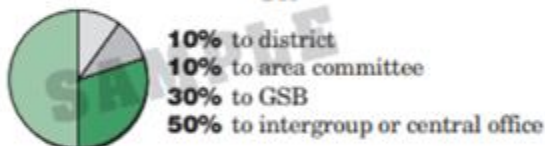
# CBIA Appreciates Ongoing Support

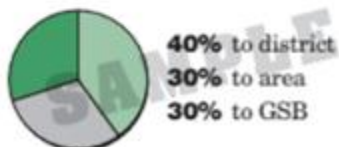

### **Helpline Help Needed!**

**More people are needed for "The Helpline"**. The Helpline is staffed by volunteers who make sure the hand of AA is available 24 hours a day by answering the intergroup calls overnight (5 PM to 7:45 AM) and on weekends (8 AM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday or 8 AM Sunday to 7:45 AM Monday). **This is a once-per-month commitment**. A minimum of 3 months' sobriety is required to answer calls after office hours. **If you are available to do this vital volunteer work, please contact CBIA as soon as possible to add your name.**
